ST. PAUL'S CHURCH

At the morning service yesterday, the sermon was preached by Squadron Leader, the Reverend J. M. Cameron, Padre of the local Air-Force in his opening remarks, the Padre had a message for the children. He told them of a certain man who built a boat; and when he came to sail it on the sea, a wind sprang up which blew it away from shore so that he lost it. 'Tis made the boy sad, but his sadness was later on turned into joy, for that very same boat had been recovered and he saw it one day in a store window, offered for sale. Not having the money himself with which to buy it, he asked his father for it so that the boat became his possession again. Even so, said the Padre, are we created by God, but sin creeps in and we are lost. Then came Jesus Christ, who out of His great love for us buys us back with the price of His own life.

The great question for us Christians, said the Padre, is: Do we believe in this hope? And then he referred to the first Advent. Do we believe in that? Do we really believe that God in the person of Jesus Christ, really lived? There are some persons, calling themselves Christians, who do not believe. Yet we have full proof of it: geological proof, archaeological proof, historical proof, and above all, Biblical proof. The pages of the Old Testament live with the message of the coming of the Messiah, the words of the prophets foretold His coming, or His birth of Him, His death and resurrection. All this is borne out in the historical pages of the synoptic gospels, and His character and mission the pages of St. John's gospel.

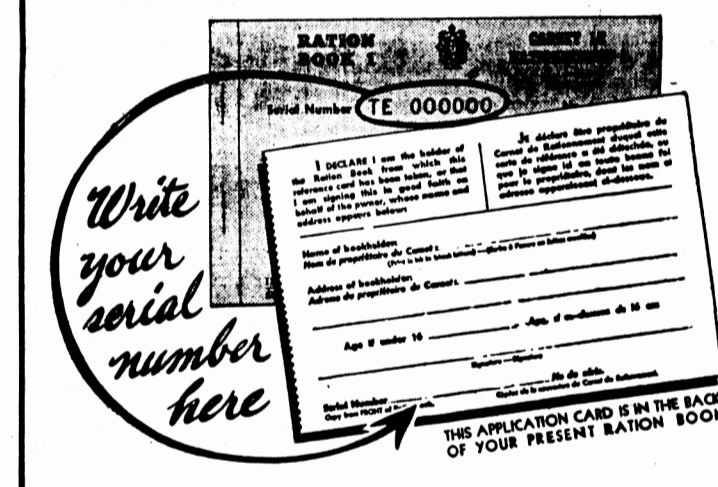
RATION BOOK No. 2 - HOW AND WHEN TO GET IT

For the convenience of the public and to ensure speedy distribution, New Ration Book No. 2 will be issued locally at the following distribution centres.

Table with columns: ADDRESS, NAME, HOURS. Lists various locations in Charlottetown and their respective hours for Ration Book No. 2 distribution.

DATES FEB. 19th to FEB. 28th

The new Ration Book will NOT be mailed to you. It must be called for. Before you can secure the new Ration Book you must fill in and surrender the application card in the back of your present Ration Book No. 1.



MAKE SURE ABOUT YOUR SERIAL NUMBER Your name and present place of residence (in the case of children, the residence of the parents) must be printed clearly in Block letters.

Residents of Rural Areas may apply on behalf of their neighbours, providing Ration Book No. 1, and properly filled in application cards, are presented. In the case of residents of a town or city, any senior or responsible member of a household may apply for new Ration Books on behalf of other members of the household.
