She was a truly good woman, a general favorite, and will be long remembered for her unselfishness, and kindly deeds to all with whom she was associated.

An act of signal heroism, which is worthy of all commendation and should be suitably recognized, occurred on the harbor just off Whitney Pier, Sydney, recently. H. S. Moore who is employed in the mechanical department at the Steel Co's pier, was out enjoying a skate on the glib ice passing near the track left by the S. S. Bruce on her recent trip he noticed a cap on the water and further along someone struggling and apparently exhausted. Without hesitation Mr Moore stripped off both coats, and with his skates on, plunged in to the rescue. He swam to the spot and just caught the person who was sinking in forty feet of water for the last time. The victim of the accident is a young son of John Campbell about nine years of age. Mr. Moore supported him with great difficulty and carried him to the thicker ice. In the meantime, help arrived and, by tying two coats together and throwing out this improvised rope to the brave rescuer who eventually managed to catch it in his benumbed grasp and both were pulled to life and safety. The boy was taken to the nearest store in an unconscious condition. A doctor was summoned and after much labor animation was restored. Mr. Moore was almost exhausted when dragged out of the icy waters, but after careful attention, recovered. It was a deed of exceeding bravery and there is no place one could more fittingly repose than over the breast of the courageous Mr Moore, who is a native of Crapaud, P. E. I.
