UTILIZING CANADA'S SUGAR MAPLE
All kinds of furniture are manufactured from Canada's sugar maple from solid to veneer, while the

figured veneer of bird's eye maple is particularly in demand according to the Forest Service, Department of the Interior. The strength and wearing qualities of the wood assure it a place in the vehicle industry, where it is used for heavy axles, frames, sleigh runners, factory trucks, bicycle wheel rims, etc. Because of its toughness it is made into baseball bats, hockey sticks, billiard cues, paddles, croquet balls, mallets, etc. The sugar maple is a leading wood for flooring, and its strength and stiffness suits it for the great variety of tool handles that are made from it.
