### MARITIME BOYS CAMP LETTER

#### Special to The Guardian— Written By an Islander Who is Camping out

Maritime Boys' Camp, July 21st. On the morning of the 17th inst. twenty-one Charlottetown boys and one from Summerside, left for Maritime Boys Camp, held at Sutherland River, Pictou Co., N.S. The trip was greatly enjoyed by the boys, many of whom have never taken a very long trip from home before.

On arrival at camp at 5 p.m. of the same day all were assigned to their tents which had been pitched the day before. The tents were pitched in the form of a large circle. The boys from any one town were divided up as well as they could be, that is so that not more than two boys from any one town will be in the same tent. This gives them a chance to get better acquainted with boys from the other towns. There are one hundred and sixty-nine boys and leaders in camp—each separate tent has a leader.

The boys come from all parts of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island. Some are from as far as Yarmouth, N.S. and Fredericton, N.B. All the Island boys are in good health and enjoying themselves immensely. The following is a sample of what the boys do during the day. At 7 a.m. the rising whistle blows. Morning dip in the salt water which lasts for five minutes. Then a wash and brush up for breakfast which is at 7:30 a.m. After breakfast a 15 minute Bible Class is held. This class is short, helpful, and very interesting, and is led by Rev. F. O. Erb.

The boys then disperse to their tents and spread their blankets on the ground outside their tent to air. Baseball, football, cricket and other games are then participated in, till 11 a.m., when the whistle blows for a swim. To see about 150 boys in the water is a sight one will soon forget. There are three ranges of boats in charge of leaders, who keep near where the boys are swimming, so that in case of accident help will be near. The camp doctor is generally either in one of the boats or on the shore near by. A very much enjoyed feature of the swimming hour is the "Shoot the Chutes." Three boys at a time get on a small car and shoot down a frame work into the water. This frame work is built down the side of the bank and is very steep. The speed with which the cars travel down this frame work is very rapid. The car when it reaches the bottom shoots out across the water a short distance and generally tips. The boys then swim for shore. Dinner at 12 o'clock and oh! my how the fellows do stow away the grub. In the afternoon, games, etc., and at 3 p.m. another swim. Ten at 5 p.m. At 8 p.m. the boys are called together and the evenings are spent in singing, story-telling and talks by the leaders. These talks are intended to lead boys to think right thoughts, keep their lives pure and clean, and to teach them how to "help the other fellows," which is the camp motto. At 9:30 the boys prepare for bed and at 10 p.m. the whistle blows for lights out.
