Student Lists In Social Work Grows

TORONTO, Sept. 3.—(CP)—The number of students entering Canada's seven schools of social work this year is almost double the 1943 figure, it was revealed as registration opened for the fall term.

Realizing the profession is expanding in Canada, many former servicemen and women have registered for the courses at the Maritime School of Social Work, Halifax, and at the schools in the Universities of Montreal, Laval, McGill, Toronto, Manitoba and British Columbia.

In Toronto, 115 persons have signed up, compared with 63 last year. Forty per cent of the new students are men, among them several former high-ranking officers in the armed services.

Older than the average university student, the war veteran looking for a career, will find this maturity to his advantage in social work where persons in their middle twenties are preferred to younglings.

At present there are not more than 1,000 qualified social workers in Canada, most of them members of the Canadian Association of Social Workers. Five or six times as many would be engaged said Dr. Cassidy.

The sudden expansion of social work in Canada is partially responsible for the shortage of workers as the schools have not been able to supply enough graduates to meet increased needs.

Salaries have markedly improved, said Dr. Cassidy. "At the present time a qualified social worker may earn anywhere from \$2,000 to \$3,000 a year. Executive and administrative posts offer salaries up to \$5,000 and sometimes above that."
