## CONCLUSION OF THE ADDRESS

Of Counsel For The Prosecution In The Case Of Jenkins, Vs. McNeill

Owing to the length of the address of Counsel it was impossible with the space at the disposal of The Guardian yesterday to publish Mr. Mellish's comments in the case of two concluding witnesses. He said as follows:—

THOMAS DONOVAN. Thomas Donovan suffers from bronchial trouble. Or at least he told the doctor so, and duly got the liquor he asked for on the 25th of Jan'y the 11th of Feb'y, the day before the City election, the 14th of March, the 28th of March, 2nd of April and 4th of April. Not only did he get the liquor on his own diagnosis, but Byrne Bro's had such doubt as to the medicinal use he would make of the liquor, that they refused on one occasion to fill his prescription and he had to take it back to the Dr. and get it changed to one of the druggists. How convinced the defendant must have been that Thomas Donovan was going to use the liquor he asked for medicinal purposes.

JOHN DONOVAN. J. Donovan has a personal examination made by Dr. McNeill. This was in Beadin's shop. He took his temperature and examined him and then prescribed 12 oz spirits. I do not ask Your Honor to convict on this evidence, as he was the best judge whether the man needed it or not. This in the solitary case where an examination was made.—But here is another order—on April 8. It was on the Two Macs, vendors. John goes there for it but he is so drunk they will not give it to him! He goes back again to the Doctor and the Doctor changes the prescription to A. W. Reddin and he gets it at the druggists, Reddin's. When Mr. McDonald of the 2 Macs was on the stand he stated that he had refused to fill many of the Doctor's prescriptions—on cross-examination by the Doctor he admitted that the Doctor had told him that in cases where he had told him that in cases where he was not to fill it. Here we have a specific case.—

John Donovan goes to the doctor tells his story pays the fee and gets the order; he then goes to the vendors who refuse to fill it because he is under the influence of liquor, but he goes to the doctor and the doctor changes the address in the prescription to A. W. Reddin, after having had notice from the Two Macs that this man should not get liquor signified by their refusal of it.
