He tells the public that it is Mr. Sharp, Superintendent, or Contractor Campbell's business to allow or disallow the public to travel over the approaches. I wish the public to know that I waited upon the Commissioner of Public Works and Mr. Peters, the Attorney General, and told these gentlemen that I was willing to allow the public to travel over my work on the approaches if they would put on night watchmen to look after my lumber and tools, plant, etc., The Commissioner refused to do so and said that he had two men on at present in daytime. I told him to take one of those men off in daytime and put him on at night. Mr. Cummins says I could make an arrangement to allow the public to travel on the bridge, therefore the public can see it is up to Mr. Cummins to place watchmen on the bridge at night if he wishes the travelling public to be accommodated. KNIVES AFFECT SHIP'S COMPASS

LONDON, May 19.—There have been a number of wrecks for some time past owing to the inexplicable errors of the compass. This led to the underwriters of such craft sailing from Grimsby to make an investigation with the result that they discovered the deflections of the compass were due to a special type of large clasp knife that is popular among local fishermen for use in their work. The method of tempering the knife in the course of manufacture confers upon it magnetic properties, that are so powerful that when it is in a wheelman's pocket it deflects the needle two or three points and, as the man moves the needle gyrates in the oddest manner. The knives were recognized as dangerous, and the skippers are forbidding anybody to enter the bridge with one of them.

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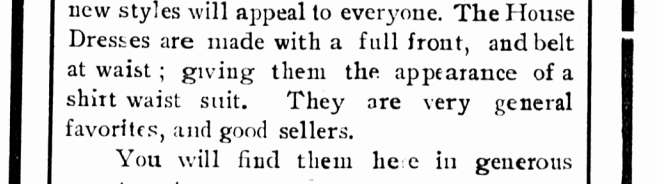
