IN MEMORIAM

ROBERT GOLDING FRIZZELL

On November 20th, 1936, he passed away at the P. E. I. Hospital Robert Golding Frizzell, at the age of sixty-six years. The late Mr. Frizzell was a respected resident of North Wilshire, in which community he lived for the greater part of his life. For a few years he resided in Bonshaw, but later moved back to North Wilshire where he was highly regarded as a neighbor and friend.

Having taken seriously ill, Mr. Frizzell entered the hospital for medical and surgical treatment, which it was hoped would bring relief and prolong his life. This hope proved vain. After the second operation he failed to rally, and in a few days passed away. He was twice married, first to Miss Elmira Godfrey of North Wilshire, and after her decease to Miss Millie Balderston, of the same place. She also predeceased him. Four sons and three daughters are left to mourn, Ray of Charlottetown, Wilfred of Scotch Settlement, N. B. Murchison of Charlottetown, and Harrison of North Wilshire. The daughters are, Hazel, Mrs. Palethorpe of Toronto, Liddle, Mrs. Hannigan, of Scotch Settlement, N. B. and Beatrice of North Wilshire. There are also thirteen grandchildren. He is also survived by a sister, Mrs. Alex Henderson of Scotch Settlement, N. B. and by five brothers, William, Daniel, Charles, Albert and Pope. The funeral, which was attended, was held on November 24th from his late residence to the North Wilshire United Church, and was conducted by the pastor, Rev. W. A. MacQuarrie. Favorite hymns were sung by the United Church Choir. The pall bearers were Arthur Smith, William Clark, Howard Bolderson, Edson Easter, Daniel MacDonald, and Daniel MacLean. (C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, Dec. 20—The business of "Professor" Joe Lavoie, French-Canadian tattoo artist has gone to his head. As proof he donned his hat and exhibits a likeness of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, famous Canadian statesman, tattooed there.

Joe, exterior decorator of hundreds of sailors from ocean and Lake boats, entering Montreal harbor, claims he is the only man in Canada with a tattooed scap. Lavoie is proud of his "masterpieces", the work of 25 years. His best, he says, has travelled to the south pole on the broad back of Richard Dickie, seaman on Admiral Byrd's second expedition to the Antarctic. Dickie now lives in Vancouver.

Summer is the rush season for the Professor. Then the boat crews arrive. Some lake boat sailors, he said, have their work executed in instalments, so much each time their freighter reaches port. Complicated designs take 10 hours to finish.

Use Minard's for Bites. King Seeks Lord Wigranis Advocate (C.P. Cable By Guardian's Special Wire)

LONDON, Dec. 20—Giving in the Observer his "after thoughts" on the abdication of Edward VIII and the accession of King George VI, J. L. Garvin today said, in part: "What the King (George) has done in the first days of his reign is as right and telling as what he has said. His purpose, like that of his father whom he resembles, is not only to walk within the letter of the constitution but to be guided by the spirit that is in every way required for an active and unflinching concord between the Crown and the ministers, parliament and peoples."

"For the better attainment of this end, the King recalled Lord Wigram to his right hand as private adviser. This was an act of more happy significance than it might first seem. It restores the informal but most valuable link in the working relations between the monarchy and the government."

"One defect of the former reign was an increasing omission of an advisory safeguard. Counsel at the sovereign's side lost its accustomed part. "Trained for many years in the same school with the experienced and matured father of the present King Lord Wigram is equipped like nobody else to maintain a wise advisory tradition."

"To deal with extreme cases of deadlock and dislocation in the parliamentary system is the most vital political office remaining to the Crown. When Queen Victoria desired to adjust a stubborn dispute between the two houses on reform bills more than 50 years ago it was Sir Henry Ponsoby, as her confi-

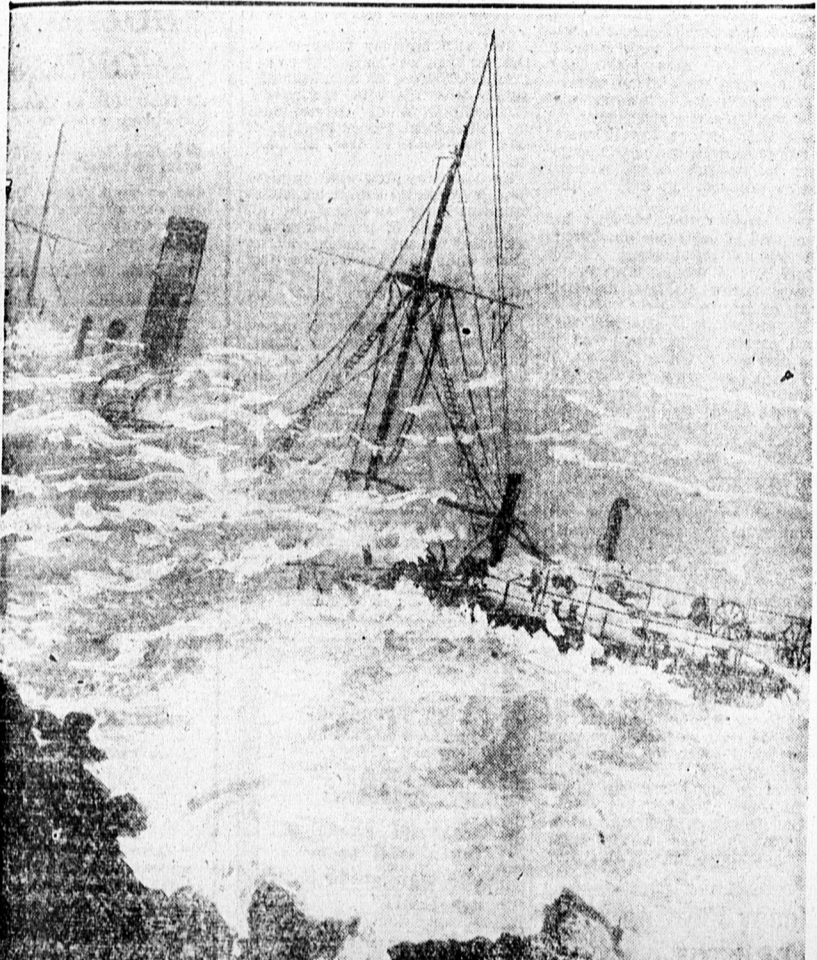

Tempests Lash Stricken Freight Ship S. S. Kings County Hard Upon Rocks

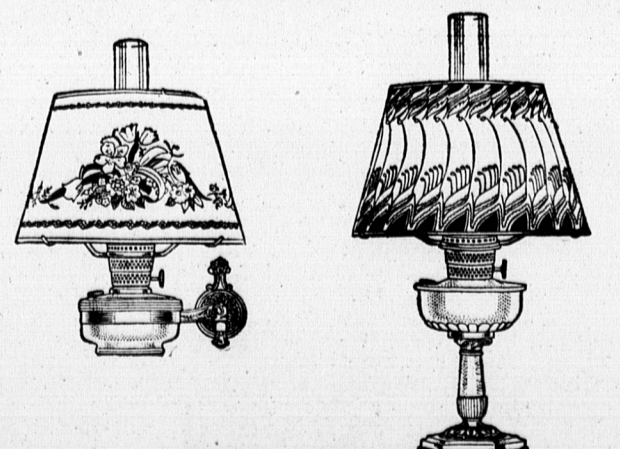


SAINT JOHN, N. B. Dec. 21—(CP)—Preliminary inquiry into the wreck of the county line freighter Kings County at Lornville last Friday is under way, with H. E. Kane, vice-consul for Norway, presiding. The hearing was behind closed doors and no statement was made. View shows the almost submerged vessel lashed and pounded by sea and high as at. Kane said his report would go direct to Norwegian government and the main inquiry would be held in Norway after Captain Emil Massee and his crew return to that country. Present as assessors at the hearing here were two Norwegian captains, masters of ships now in port. Most members of the crew left for home in Norway over the week-end. They lost all their belongings in the wreck and were outfit ed here.
