BONNYCASTLE RESIGNS SEAT.

WINNIPEG, August 17—A. L. Bonnycastle, conservative, who was declared elected for Russell in the provincial election after a recount, made the statement last night that he had resigned his seat. Bonnycastle's opponent was first declared elected by thirteen, but the recount gave the seat to Bonnycastle, owing to the number of ballots having extraneous pencil marks. The liberals claimed these ballots were spoiled while in the possession of the returning officer after the election, they being admittedly poorly guarded, but this is denied by the statement of resignation. Bonnycastle expressly denied any knowledge of it, or that he was convinced that any irregularity occurred but in view of the fact that there might be some doubt he decided to resign.

DESSAU, Germany, Aug. 18—Police, gendarmes and foresters are to-day conducting a search of the hills and forests in this vicinity for the remains of a balloon and its probable passengers, which was last night seen flaming in the sky.

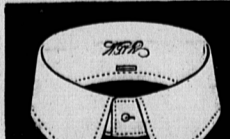

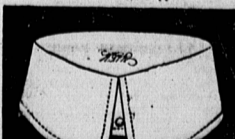

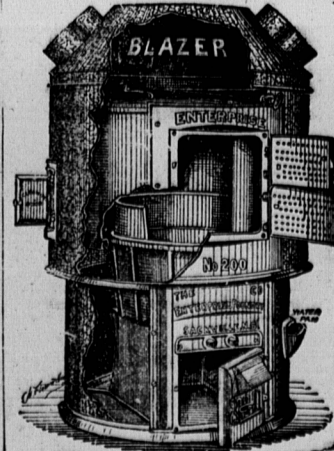
