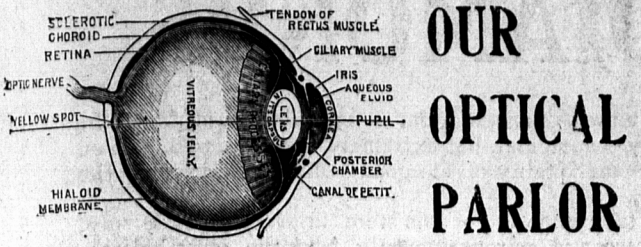

COLIN MATHESON, Port Elgin, N. B. and his sister, Mrs. McPherson left on Monday evening for her home on P. E. Island. Mr Matheson accompanied her as far as Sackville and returned on Tuesday's evening train.

SINCE January 1st the Sydney building inspector, has issued permits for over a hundred thousand dollars worth of new buildings in Sydney. The exact number of permits up to date is thirty-one and the total estimated cost for erection and repairing is \$115,450. The number of permits issued last year was twenty-five.

The suggestion has been made by a number of people that before winter, a special train be run from Charlottetown to Murray Harbor and return the same day, thus affording citizens an opportunity of seeing the new road. Since the new line was opened Thanksgiving Day, no trip of this kind has been made though looked forward to by many.

REV. J. W. KEIRSTEAD has resigned the pastorate of the Baptist church at Campbellton N. B. after five years acceptable service, and accepted a call from the Baptist congregation of Oxford, N. S. Mr. Keirstead preached his farewell sermon on Sunday Nov. 26th. There was a large congregation present. On Wednesday evening Mr. Keirstead was tendered a farewell social at the assembly rooms of the church. Mr. Keirstead was formerly stationed on the Alexandra, Hazelbrook, Ugg and Belfast Baptist circuit.

A LARGE number of Liberal Conservatives from the different counties of the province are in the city today, to take counsel together touching the general political situation, the consideration of candidates and other such matters. It is now stated that The Sun and The Star will not be sold to the Liberal party, but will continue to hold aloft the party torch of Liberal Conservatism. There is a good deal of interest regarding the plan of campaign to be decided on, as the party has apparently decided to get into harness again for active work. -St. John Sun.

BUYERS from St. John and Boston markets have been scouring the country districts in this section for lambs, geese and turkeys, and in some places they have bought up everything in sight. Dealers say that while the home consumption is now about equal to the production in these lines, there is a growing scarcity in the Boston and other markets across the border, and that the demand from that quarter is bound to increase, notwithstanding the distance and the restrictions put upon trade by the United States government. At the price now prevailing for live lambs, geese, etc. the raising of them should be a profitable business of our farmers. -Globe.

THE Northern Agricultural Institute met in Mayfield Hall on the 27th ult. The financial report showed balance on hand \$101.60. The directors and officers elected were as follows: Wm. Laird, Pres; Adam Brown, V. P.; Walter Buntain, George R. McNeill, Nelson Orr, James Arthur, Lemuel Clarke, John Houston, additional directors; and A. J. Moffatt, Secy. Treas; Pierce McNeill, Auditor. Subjects were chosen from the program prepared at the office of Commissioner of Agriculture and those added were: 1-Dairy Cattle breeding, stabling and feeding; 2-Horses breeding, training and manures and fertilizers; 3-The land we live in, the great man past and present, agricultural possibilities and her destiny; 4-General cultivation and seeds; 5-Nature study; 7-How can we make farm life more attractive. The delegates appointed to attend the Convention were Wm. Laird, Pres. and Geo. R. McNeill. The Institute expressed the hope that the farmers and farmers' sons would avail themselves of the benefits to be derived from attending the Short Course to be held in Charlottetown on the 11th to 15th.

THE Colonial Herald of Sept. 19th, 1840 contains the following notice which was signed by one hundred respectable householders:-Whereas thefts and depredations are committed nightly in Charlottetown and many of these have been allowed to go unpunished, a meeting will be held at the hour of twelve o'clock on Monday the 21st inst in the Court House to consider the expediency of forming a society for the detection and prosecution of offenders. All persons desirous of promoting this object are requested to attend.

DR. F. C. STEPHENSON returned last night from an extended trip throughout New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia in the interest of the Young People's forward movement for missions. He reports that the maritime provinces are experiencing one of the best years in their history. Trade is brisk, crops good, prices booming and wages at the coal mines, and in fact throughout the entire provinces exceptionally high. He says that although he has been across the continent this year, he has seen nothing in the Dominion to compare with the iron, steel and coal enterprises at the Sydneys. The Dominion Iron and Steel Works are in full blast, turning out, direct from the ore, 750 tons of iron per day and running out steel rails and wire by the mile. The monthly pay roll is something like \$165,000 while the Dominion Coal Co. pays out over \$300,000 and the other small concerns combined over \$700,000 per month. Everybody is busy, and yet people find time to consider the missionary question. The Sydney district is organized and hopes to be able to support a missionary. All the districts in Nova Scotia excepting one have organized district leagues. New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island have pledged \$1,885 towards the forward movement, and all the districts save the Fredericton have organized district leagues. -Toronto World.

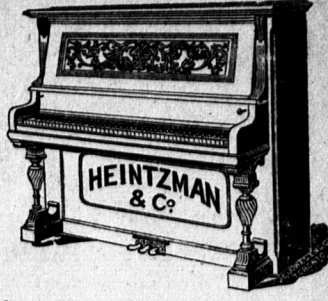
