GENS. KUROKI AND OKU JOIN FORCES

JAPS STRENGTHENING POSITIONS.

LONDON, Aug. 27.—(Special).—There is absolutely no fresh news from Port Arthur but the Japanese are believed to be strengthening their hold on the positions gained to better attack the remaining fortifications.

Generals Kuroki and Oku have joined forces in an attempt to cut the Russian line between Aenshang and Han Dian Sian and a desperate fight ensued on Thursday and continued throughout Friday with fearful slaughter.

STRIKE AND LOCKOUT OVER IN NEW YORK

It Will Come to an End on Monday—Master Plumbers Consent to Offered Increase in Wages.

NEW YORK, Aug. 27.—(Special).—The lockout and strike of thirteen hundred plumbers in Brooklyn will come to an end on Monday. The master plumbers have consented to an increase of their wages to \$4.75 a day beginning next January for two years.

The warehouses for an important feature in this settlement, as the vast majority of imported commodities were stored by order of the Russian governor until the duties were paid. It was this feature of the Russian occupation which caused such vigorous protest to be made at St. Petersburg by the Foreign Offices of England, Germany and the United States.
