**FLOW OF NATURAL GAS

MONCTON, April 19.—The Mat-

400 feet and at 1,700 feet oil sands
were reached which gave a natural
flow of 100 feet in an 8 inch pipe.

**STURDY CHEEKBONE
SAVED GIRL'S LIFE.**

NEW YORK, April 18.—Two murt-
ders, one of them unusual, and a third
murderous assault are on the police
records this morning as occurring
within the past twelve hours.
Robert Fullam, 38 years old, was
fatally stabbed in the throat on his
own front steps in the Bronx, while
trying to protect his son from a
neighbor's attack. He died two hours
later in a hospital.
Lawrence Gasso, 23 years old, was
shot during a street argument.
Matilda Villy, 22 years old, was shot
by a rejected suitor, but thanks to
a sturdy cheekbone, was only slight-
ly wounded.

LONDON, April 18.—When Mrs.
Mary Fry came before Police Magis-
trate Love today for trial on the
charge of fraud in selling a railway
ticket which Inspector Sanders of the
Children's Aid Society gave her to
Toronto, she pleaded not guilty, in-
stead of guilty, as expected.
Crown Attorney McKillop, after a
conference with the Magistrate, de-
cided that he could not succeed on a
fraud charge. Then it was decided
that no action for theft could be
taken. Under the Railway Act the
woman is liable for selling ticket
but no charge was laid, so she was
dismissed.

INDIANS DYING OF STARVATION.

WINNIPEG, April 18.—A despatch
from Fort Chippewyan tells a story
of starvation among the Indians. In
the immediate vicinity they are liv-
ing on muskrats. Farther north six-
ty are said to have died from star-
vation and dysentery. At Fond du
Lac, twelve have died since February
out of a very small band. Provi-
sions are at a very low ebb at Chip-
peewyan.
Wolves are also reported ravenous.
They are very savage, and have at
times attacked people, though no fa-
tal results are reported. The dogs
are in a miserable condition, through
lack of food, and the teams are un-
able to bring more than small loads
from Fond du Lac, where deer are
plentiful.
