The vice-chancellor, in allowing the separate-maintenance plea, said of mothers-in-law in general: "They should, by all means, unless decrepit and poverty-stricken, either work or, if of a wealthier class, stay away from their sons' or daughters' homes. They cause more trouble than any other thing in married life."
