ANNUAL MEETING OF RIFLEMEN

The annual prize matches of the Provincial Rifle Association concluded yesterday were the finest of the meeting they were however by no means ideal; the wind varied continuously; the light was very unsteady and the targets were scarcely for two shots in the same conditions. Nevertheless yesterday was the last day of the meeting and the interest particularly in the afternoon was intense. A large number of ladies were in attendance and the ladies matches were well contested. During the day, His Honor Lieut Governor McKinnon and the D. O. C., Lieut. Col. Moore, were interested spectators, and His Honor opened the firing at the second stage of the Corporation Match with a bull's eye.

In the forenoon the Corporation Match consisting of two stages—200 and 500 yards was fired. The light conditions were not the best, but a number of excellent scores were made, many of the men being over 80. At the 200 yards Capt. J. M. Jones made a possible. In the afternoon the Ladies Challenge Cup Match was fired. In this match only the thirty-six highest marksmen in the Special Aggregate are entitled to shoot, ten rounds each at 50 yards. This match was the most interesting of the meeting. Major W. A. Weeks who shot for Mrs. J. A. Longworth and Capt. J. M. Jones who shot for Mrs. M. A. Allan tied with 47. They then followed by four bulls. Major Weeks however made the good score of five bulls and won the cup for Mrs. Longworth. The Ladies matches created much interest, some excellent shooting was done, and the ladies proved that they know how to handle the rifle.

On the whole, the meeting despite weather conditions was most successful and the hundred marksmen present were well satisfied. The marksmen this year were in charge of Sgt. E. V. Hessian, and the marking was well performed.

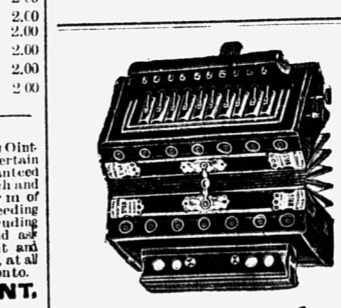

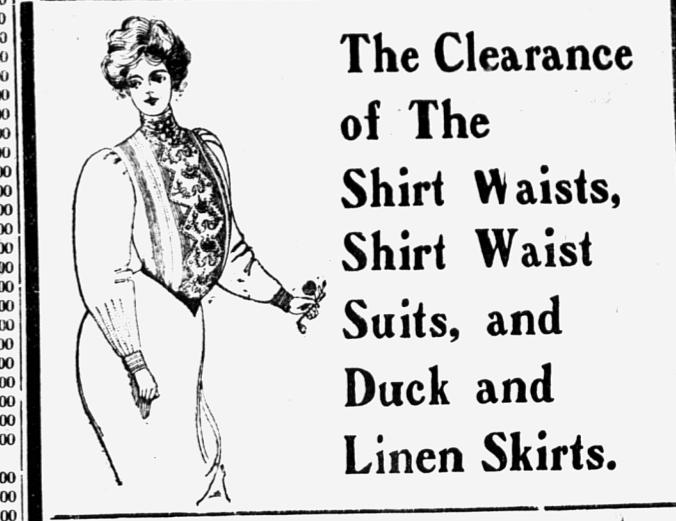
