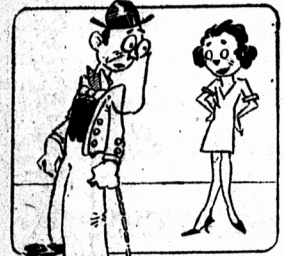

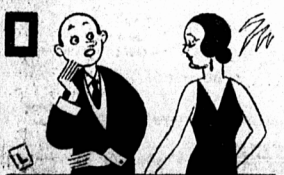

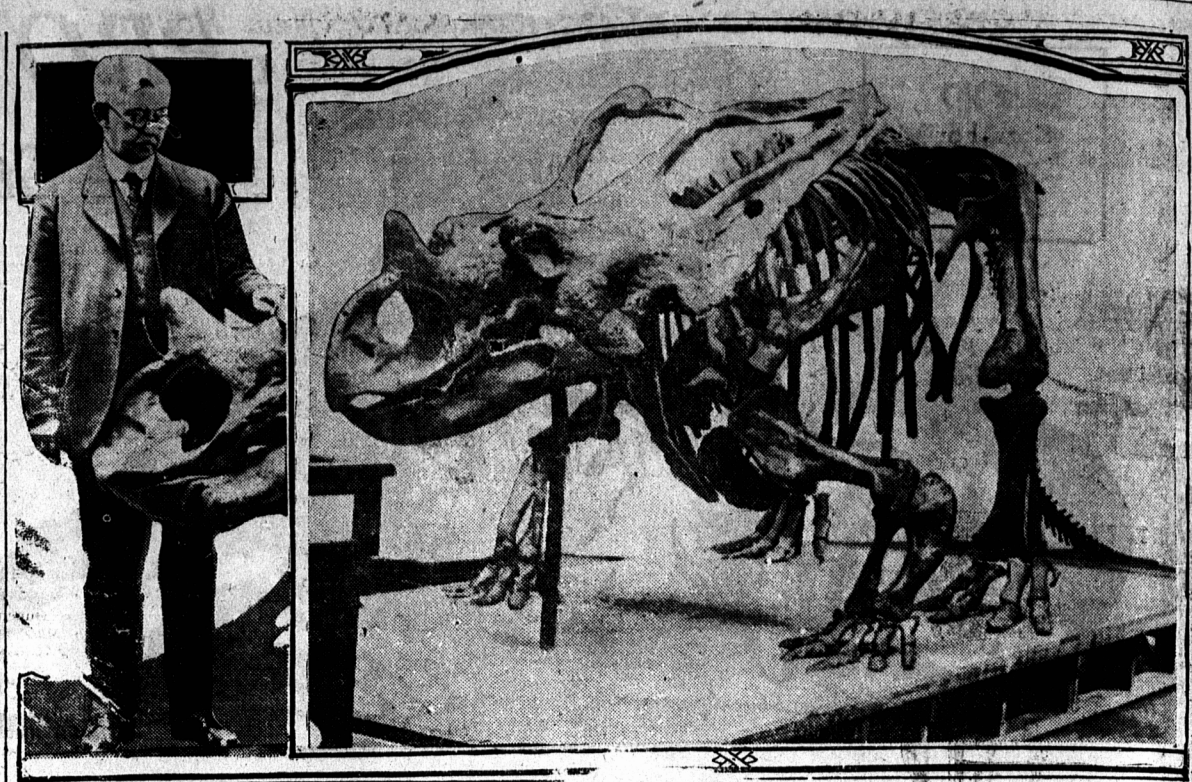

BOMBAY, Dec. 14.—Owing to the complete failure of the Southwest Monsoon and the non-appearance of the Northwest Monsoon, Combarore, Salem and Tinnevely—three important cotton growing districts in South India—are experiencing a severe drought. The river Tambarbarni which has never failed within living memory, is completely dry in consequence of which the Tinnevely Ryots are doubtful of raising a single crop. Many schools in the district are closed owing to the lack of drinking water for the boys. At Salem and Combarore the situation is still worse because the wells and tanks have also dried up and a severe famine is threatened.

The expedition sent out to Alberta in 1926 to search for the remains of the early animal inhabitants of that part of the continent returned with the skeleton pictured ABOVE, one of the greatest finds of its kind ever made. It has three horns and a peculiar frill of bone along its back which distinguishes it from other species previously found. The skeleton has taken two years of continuous work on the part of two experts in the Royal Ontario museum to permit a full view of Chasmosaurus Belli, and standing by the head, Dr. W. A. Park, who with Levi Sternberg directed the setting up.
