**"IF I'M LUCKY" BOASTS TUNEFUL SCORE, TOP SINGERS AND BAND**

Starring Vivian Blaine, Perry Como, Harry James and Carmen Miranda, and boasting a score of six new songs hits by famed composers Joe Myrow and Eddie De Lange, "If I'm Lucky," 20th Century-Fox's new musical, opens today at the Prince Edward Theatre.

The picture, set against the background of an exciting election campaign, tells the story of the orchestra's fight to make the "mole" and of a gal and two fellows who find that love and politics mix with a vengeance.

**HOLLY SAUCE**  
Plain jelly, blanc mange or snow pudding may be turned into a special Christmas dessert if topped with holly sauce.  
2 tablespoons sugar  
1 teaspoon cornstarch  
Pinch of salt  
2 egg yolks or one whole egg  
1/2 teaspoon vanilla  
1/4 cup milk  
1/4 cup maraschino cherries,  
coarsely chopped.  
Mix sugar, cornstarch, salt and milk (one cup) and heat in double boiler. Beat egg yolks slightly with remaining milk. Add slowly to hot milk, stirring constantly. Cook until mixture is thick and will coat a spoon (about 10 minutes). Remove from heat, add flavoring and cherries. Six servings.
