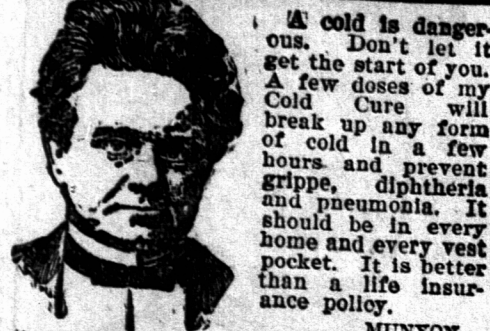

PLEADS FOR THE BIRDS.

Preacher Asks Women not to wear Plumage of Songsters.

PHILADELPHIA, April 9.—The good women of Dr. Rutledge's church are now looking up ribbon and chiffon hat trimmings and wondering if it is any worse to wear the feathers of birds than the homes of silk worms on their hats and bonnets.

Dr. Rutledge made a pathetic plea for the birds last night. He said the condemnation of heaven was upon the reckless whim of women in pandering to the folly that calls for the destruction of the innocent.

"As the war on the feathered tribes goes on," he said, "the sunlight grows dull and the beauty of the flowers is lost in blushes of shame. The zephyrs play a dirge through the tree top. Birds' wings and feathers in a young woman's hat make her look like a moving morgue—a tribute to a heartless cruelty. What a stain is cast upon our civilization! I appeal to the women of this congregation to go away with the firm determination never again to encourage the trade in the birds by pandering to a low taste."

Some of Dr. Rutledge's hearers smiled. They knew, alas, that the barnyard and not the woodland had contributed the feathers in their headgear.

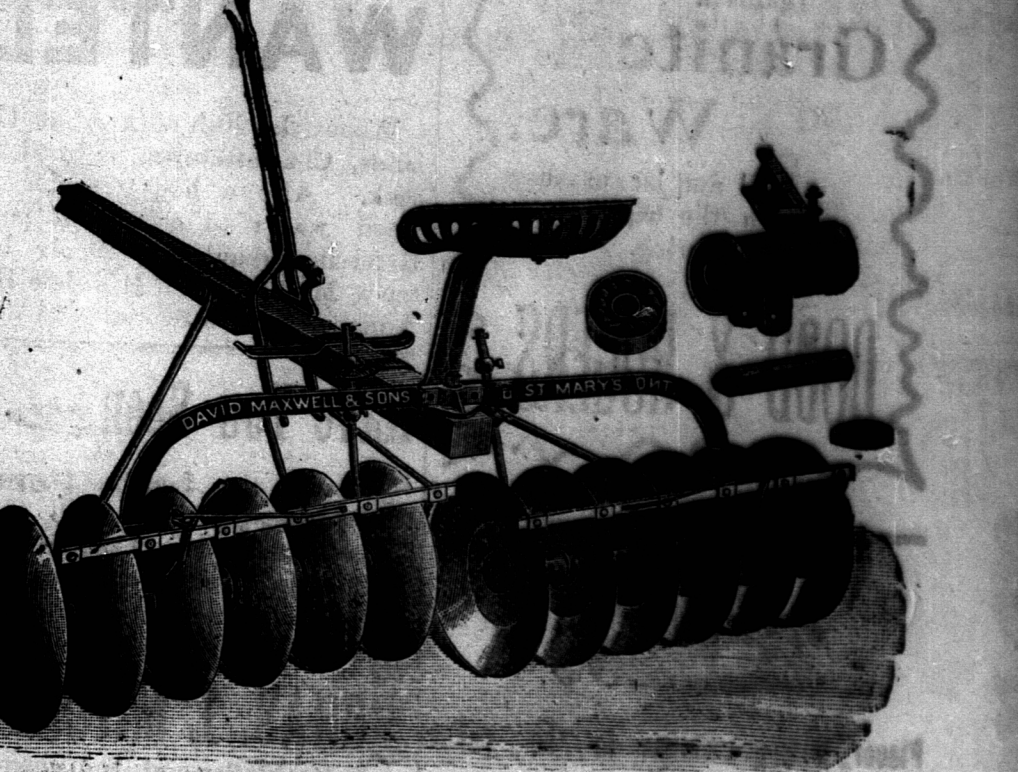
