This head dress has a band of glittering jet circling the head, the cross band, also of jet, supporting the lace ruching which may be in black or gold lace. Naturally, the hair must be worn high to give it support. When becoming this type of head dress is very striking and smart.



Simple and Unusual Hair Ornaments for Evening Wear

The upper figure shows the head circled with a band of gold, silver or brilliant, with rings and tassels on either side, and at one side is caught a wisp of tulle to be draped very lightly about the neck and shoulders. The tulle may be in a vivid color or in black or a soft cloudy grey.

The lower illustration might be mistaken for that of a boudoir cap. Nevertheless, it is displayed along with the other two in one of the smartest of the metropolitan shops, classed as an "evening head-dress." It is made of gold net, filled with gold lace, with pendants of rather heroic size in a vivid green.

Any of these arrangements might be made at home without much effort. The upper one only might be something of a problem; but narrow mealraid or cord might be selected for the band proper, three or four strands being braided together. The rings could be crocheted with metal thread and the tassels be made either of the thread or of beads in contrasting color.
