Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole heir of a family of any male over fifteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available 16 million land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entries by proxy may be made at any Dominion Land Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$300 per acre.

Duties Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a pre-empted homestead in certain districts. Price \$200 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months on or near the land, cultivate 30 acres and erect some worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony soil. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

The sincere sympathy of a large circle of friends goes to the bereaved family at home. Mr. C. C. Carlton, Miss Matilda and Miss Susie.

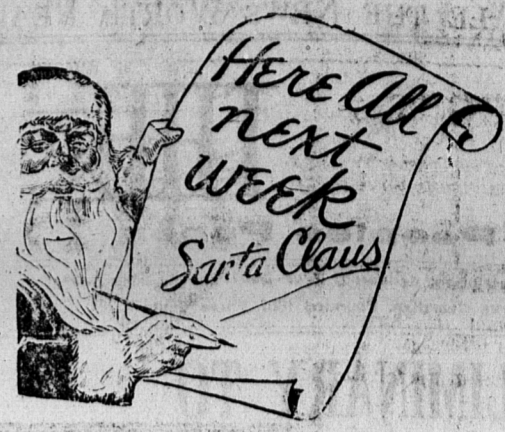
MRS. DONALD McCALLUM

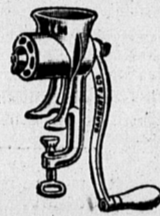

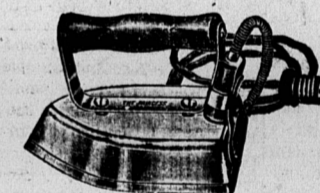
