STAMPS OF SMALL AND LARGE DENOMINATIONS suitable for use on drafts, bills of exchange, and overdrafts—made by banks and as called for under the excise tax act can be secured at the Inland Revenue Office, Charlottetown, Summerside and at Custom Offices, Tignish, Alberton, Souris, Montague, Georgetown. Stamps of the denomination from 2 cents up to \$10.00 have been issued. Instructions have been received by the Collector of Inland Revenue that suits consisting of pants, vests, and coats (READY MADE CLOTHING) is subject to a tax of 15 per cent on the amount in excess of \$45.00. Clothing covered by this item made to the order, and measure of each individual customer by a merchant, tailor, or four-man tailors in his employ, the tax shall be payable on the amount in excess of \$60.00. This amendment takes effect in respect of clothing delivered on, or after the 1st day of June, but the tax already paid on such clothing is not subject to adjustment by way of return if such clothing has already been paid for. The tax on pipes sold in excess of \$2.50 each by jewellers operating under Special Jewellers license is 20 per cent. It is the intention of the Department that the Excise Tax Act, and Amendments be rigidly enforced, and that all delinquents will be prosecuted. 1413.
