ABIE BLOCK

NEW YORK, Feb. 16 (AP)—A slow dribble of buying orders kept stock prices moving upward in the market today.

Final quotations generally were ahead by fractions to around 2 points. At the same time the stock lists was salted with a fair number of losses, mostly a point or less. Steels and motors found the going rougher than most other groups.

The advance was shaky and of- ten ground to a full stop. Absence of any kind of substantial selling, rather than any real increase in buying interest, was rated as a favorable factor.

Turnover expanded to 700,000 shares from 610,000 Tuesday, which was the smallest in months. Professional elements in the market did most of the business while the general public refused to become involved.

The Associated Press average of 67 stocks advanced 3 of one point to 62.7.

TORONTO, Feb. 16 (CP)—Base metals edged slowly upwards on the Toronto Stock Exchange today to climb back to last Wednesday's price levels. The group showed scattered advances in early trading and increased the pace of advance in the last hour to gain almost a point on the exchange's list.

New Jason featured the gold list trading some 160,000 shares for a trading session at a new high at 75 cents. A handful of junior and senior gold producers moved downward.

Consolidated Smelters continued its recovery movement in base metals, adding 2-3/4 at 109 1/2. Fenit Orelli and its subsidiary, Fenit-MacDonald, gained 15 cents and Noranda was ahead 1-2.

At Montreal

MONTREAL, Feb. 16 (CP)— Securities traded today on the Montreal stock exchange and curb market failed to make any decisive movement. Feature of the sluggish activity was Consolidated Smelting, which firmed three points for the widest advance of the day. Selected mines posted a majority of narrow gains during light dealings.

Industrial sales were down ap- proximately 8,700 shares from yesterday at 22,800 and mining volume totaled 113,300 shares, 2,100 fewer than the previous session.

Closing averages indicated banks unchanged at 27.39; utilities off 1 at 71.4; industrials up 4 at 123.3; combined up 2 at 106; papers up 3.20 at 308.6; golds off 28 at 65.47.
