WORK on the Summerside breakwater has been concluded for this year and the tug Alert will remove a number of the scows and other gear to Sydney in a day or two. The tug Gypsy will be taken to Piclou where Messrs. McDonald and Moffatt are building a new wharf. Mr. Armstrong informs us that operations will be resumed in the spring, as early as possible, when it is expected a larger force of men and better appliances will be at work.
