ST. JAMES CHURCH ANNUAL MEETING.

The Annual meeting of St. James Church congregation was held last night. On motion John A. Lawson was selected chairman and D. R. McLennan, Secy.

After devotional exercises led by Rev. T. F. Fullerton the minutes of last annual meeting were read and adopted.

T. C. James submitted the report of the session. It dealt with the increased attendance at the church services, the death of members twenty two having passed away including Arch. Kennedy, "the father of the session" the Sabbath School, and other matters pertaining to the welfare of the church.

Mr. James also read the reports of the Sabbath School, the Religious and Benevolent society, Ladies Aid Society, the Y. M. L. A. Young People's Guild and the Boys Brigade.

The question of the election of an elder was discussed at considerable length by members of the congregation.

A Lord submitted the report of the trustees. It dealt with the death of the late Mr. Kennedy, the finances of the year, the good work of the Ladies Aid, the Young Men's Literary Society and the choir. The report recommended a renovation to the manse to the extent of \$1200. The report was adopted after some discussion of the manse question, several speaking in favor of a new manse.

In passing the estimates the salary of the minister was increased from \$1400 to \$1600. In moving and seconding the motion to that effect W. S. Stewart and J. A. McDonald paid a high tribute to the pastor.

The retiring trustees were Dr. Blanchard, John McLachern, W. S. Stewart, and Geo. E. Auld, who were re-elected.

A vote of thanks was passed to the Ladies Aid, the Y. M. L. A., and choir, for their excellent work during the year.

The meeting then adjourned.
