**FRACTURED A RIB**—Mr. George Bishop, an old and respected resident of Summerside had the misfortune to slip and fall on the icy sidewalk on Wednesday last, the result being the fracture of a rib. His body had to be bandaged and he is at present confined to the house.

**FINDING OF BODY**—The Halifax Herald, referring to the finding there of the body of Capt. Walsh of Summerside says: "Diver John Gregorie, who on Saturday brought to the surface the remains of Abraham Cox, who was drowned at the head of the cable wharf on the night of November 23, has also found the body of Captain Walsh, of the schooner Beaver, at Mill Cove, Dartmouth. The remains of the latter were lying in five fathoms of water, and were buried in mud, only one foot being left uncovered. Capt. Walsh was a well-known seafaring man, and held in the highest respect by all, especially in Summerside, where he resided. There are left to mourn a widow, three sons, Harold, in Summerside, Jack at P. of W. College, Frank in Sydney and three daughters. Mrs. Ralph Brundage, Summerside, Mrs. Byron Bowness, Charlottetown, and Miss Florrie Walsh, Calgary. The work of the diver in both cases was exceptionally hard, and he is to be commended for his success. The water at the head of the cable wharf is very deep and his task was particularly arduous.

Breach of Game laws, 1 conviction. Vagrancy, 4 convictions. Operating a gaming machine 1 conviction. Breach of the Prohibition Act, convictions 41, dismissals 16, as compared with 21 convictions and 21 dismissals in 1918.
