To Send Enquiries

As a result of anxiety over the attitude of non-member states, officials expressed belief that eventually inquiries would be sent to the United States and Germany as to whether key products barred today can reach Italy from those countries.

An official communique said the discussion of the economic committee showed the general opinion was that the most efficacious measures should be taken to quell as soon as possible the hostilities in Ethiopia, or in other words, to put the aggressor as soon as possible into a position where he cannot pursue his adventure.

Turkey and Canada were among states which were pressed for an early examination of the possibility of severing all exports to Italy.

Sanction activities centred also upon the possibility of minimizing the losses of certain states resulting from an application of sanctions by the establishment of some form of mutual support. It is not proposed, however, to give cash compensation for trade losses.

A list of key products drawn up by the economic committee includes the following: Italian imports from League countries: manganese, chromium, iron, tungsten, molybdenum, Vanadium, nickel.

A second list includes products Italy must get abroad but whose supply is not controlled by League states: aluminium, bauxite, steel, zinc.

A third list includes nitric acid, nitrates and rubber and a fourth list, ships, vehicles, pack animals and mechanical tools.

All of these commodities have not yet been put on the black list and some will be discussed tomorrow.
