criticism that he had never known a parliament so inert and helpless as the present house is repeated approvingly by men of both parties.

The government has been hampered by an over-weighted programme, by cumbersome procedure under the parliament act, and by the time absorbed in debating the Marconi scandal. The opposition has utterly failed to avail itself of the powerful

weapons placed in its hands by ministerial mistakes and has adopted the unsuccessful policy of seeking snap-division victories, which has made it ridiculous in the eyes of the electorate. A general demand is arising among politicians for a simplification of parliamentary procedure.


Despite the barabess of the session, the government is unquestionably in a stronger position than it was six months ago. Lloyd George was wrunged by the Marconi scandal but is recovering his fighting power and will lead in the autumn a popular campaign for land reform. Sir Edward Grey's conduct of foreign affairs is recognized by all as magnificent. The country at large is tired of political, such as the opposition has dealt out in such abundant measure, and still more tired of machine delays in both houses.
