TIMELY NOTES ON TOPICS CONNECTED WITH Silver Fox and Mink Farming

Buyers from France, Italy and Belgium attended the auction of silver fox and mutations held a week ago at Oslo, Norway. Blue fox averaged 71 kroner, silver fox 93 kroner, platinum fox 134 kroner and mink 63 kroner. Five kroner is equal to about \$1.00 so silver fox would be averaging about \$118, and platinum \$27.

Alutian mink of the mutation breed is a stellar feature in the advertising of Neiman-Marcus, noted fur merchants of New York. They claim to be first with a full length coat in this unbelievably new mutation and state they were the first to show mink, the first to show fabulous Silverblu mink and Royal Pastel mink in garments. Now in keeping with their traditions they are presenting the first full length coat of Alutian mink. The price is \$12,500, tax included. They also state that their complete fur collection includes ten colors of mink.

A meeting of Wisconsin fur farmers was held at Oskosh, Wisconsin, last week and great indignation was expressed because the United States government had not removed the 20 per cent excise tax on furs and had permitted the free import of foreign furs. The state of Wisconsin passed an act this year requiring the labelling of all furs with their true identification.

Howard Sandman of Wausau, Wis., has consistently advocated improving the quality of silver and platinum foxes. In a recent address to a meeting of fox farmers he said, "In order to obtain top values in platinum fox the must be pale in guard hair and blue in the light blue underfur. In reference to pale guard hair I do not mean white or do I mean chalky underfur when I say light blue. If your platinum fox has a tendency to run medium dark or blue in the guard fur you are a decided asset to the trade. Results from sales bear out, as these pelts are invariably sold in the upper brackets - providing the other components of a good pelt are in evidence.
