How much the Examiner editor pines for his usual autumnal diet is quite pitiful to read. "Blueberries" is his daily cry. As this season's fruit is not yet ripe perhaps some kind friend will send him a package of the canned article. It appears to be a case of genuine distress.

The Glasgow Herald points out that if the three Kingdoms were each represented in the Commons in proportion to their population as the Canadian Provinces are represented at Ottawa, England and Wales would have thirty more members than they now have, Scotland would have one more and Ireland thirty one less than now. Yet Ireland was for a considerable period somewhat under represented in the days when her population was nearly twice as great as it is now. This affords some reason for not reducing her representation now.

Both Rev. Dr. McLeod, Conservative and Mr. Gibson, Liberal, who were pitted against each other in the general election of November last in York, N. B., have been again nominated by their respective parties and will contest the coming by-election there. Dr. McLeod in an interview with the St. John Sun says he is a follower of Mr. Borden, the Conservative leader, but will claim the rights of independent action in regard to electoral purity and prohibition. He will open the campaign with a public meeting shortly and thenceforward continue the fight to a finish.

France is so well pleased with her submarine war craft that she is now constructing twenty more, will begin five more in 1903 and has planned to construct 25 more in 1904. She expects to have a fleet of 68 submarine boats ready for service in 1906. There is nothing that the whale so much dreads as the attack of the torpedo boat, and it may yet turn out that the most dreaded foe of the battleship will be the submarine torpedo boat. In this line of naval development France has a strong lead over all other nations, Britain not excepted.

In Paris on Friday last there was a highly successful trial of an air-ship, the invention of a young Brazilian named Santos-Dumont. The ship sailed round and round a two and a quarter mile course answered to its helm perfectly and stopped at precisely the point indicated in the program. The New York Herald says: "the practical success of the voyage was such as to inspire the expert spectators with a feeling of certainty that the essential problem has been solved and that further development and improvement will make cruising at will in the upper ether a pastime of the near future."

The Northeastern, the pioneer steamship of a line running from Chicago, through the great lakes, the Canadian canals and the St. Lawrence, and thence across the Atlantic to London, evoked great interest on her arrival in the British Metropolis. The London Daily Mail in describing her said that the way the crew were housed and fed would be an eye opener to the British cargo boats. Every man was given a spring wire bed and bedding, even sheets, the crew's quarters were light and airy, lighted with electricity, and provided with well appointed lavatories, which included a bath fitted with hot and cold water. Besides this, the food served to the men was very much better than that given on English ships, the same table being set for both officers and men. The Mail further said that the steward's salary was higher than that of the majority of chief officers in British vessels. In regard to the wages paid other employes on the ship, the chief receives £25 a month; the quartermaster £9, and the watchman £7, figures which the Mail declares are greatly in advance of the wages paid British sailors in similar positions.
