REPLY.

Mr. Farquharson must see that there is an organic and actual connection between the enforcement or non enforcement of the Prohibitory Law in this city and the election in West Queens. He as Premier is primarily responsible for the enforcement of the law. He is also the candidate for West Queens. If the Premier chooses, by a faithful and vigorous enforcement of the law to win the approbation of the better class of the community, the candidate will necessarily share in that approbation. If on the other hand and for whatever reason the law is permitted to be continuously and openly violated, as is the case, both the Premier and the candidate, being one and the same person must share in the public censure. It is not THE GUARDIAN that makes the connection. The connection would exist if we had not written a word on the subject; it would exist if THE GUARDIAN were not in existence. The connection is in fact of Mr. Farquharson's own creation and it will remain so long as he chooses to remain in the dual role of Premier and candidate.

We confess to great surprise that the Premier or any one else should under such circumstances call upon THE GUARDIAN "to make good our statement—namely the connection of the West Queen's election with the non-enforcement of the Prohibitory Law in this city." Be it observed that the connection has not denied that the connection exists. How could he possibly do so? He has not in his letter denied a single allegation made in THE GUARDIAN. How could he do so in face of the facts known of all men? He has not denied his responsibility for the due enforcement of the law. He does not in his letter claim that the law is being enforced. And again we ask, how could he do so?

With the political fortunes of men and of parties THE GUARDIAN does not greatly concern itself except in so far as in our judgment the public good is affected thereby. But we have always taken a very deep interest in the men and the measures whose object is to promote sobriety and order. We have contended earnestly for the Scott Act and we saw it betrayed by the unholy alliance of 1897. We fought with all our force against the License Act which followed. We have denounced from time to time the deluge of whiskey poured out on election days. We know how politicians of both parties have made use of this internal agency to promote their own political fortunes. We have seen how politicians of both parties have been ever ready to cater to the liquor vote and we have greatly feared lest prohibition might be betrayed as the Scott Act has been again and again. No doubt the politicians are subjected to the temptation of obtaining votes wherever and however they can. But of one thing we are assured—the liquor interests in this city are not in politics merely for

their health. Business is business with them and when they and their satellites and the active opponents of prohibition through the primaries and the convention to support a particular candidate, it is not prohibition they are after. When such action is followed by opening their doors wide to the unlawful traffic in liquors, and no prominent man of their number is called to court to answer for such unlawful sale, what are temperance people to think?

We would be glad even yet to hope that the suspension of the enforcement of the law has been but temporary and may be followed by vigorous and just action to maintain the supremacy of the law. When we see that course adopted we shall be the first to approve and commend it. And we are assured that there is enough temperance sentiment in West Queens to endorse such action with an overwhelming majority at the polls. But there must be an equal and vigorous enforcement of the law against the big as well as against the little men in the liquor trade, against the Liberals as well as the Tories who are defying the law, before the public confidence can be restored. Public confidence has been shaken by the long carouse visible on our streets during the weeks past, because in the public mind the enforcement of the law has been relaxed for political reasons. That opinion can only be changed, and we earnestly hope and pray that it may be changed by the honest and vigorous enforcement of the law hereafter.
