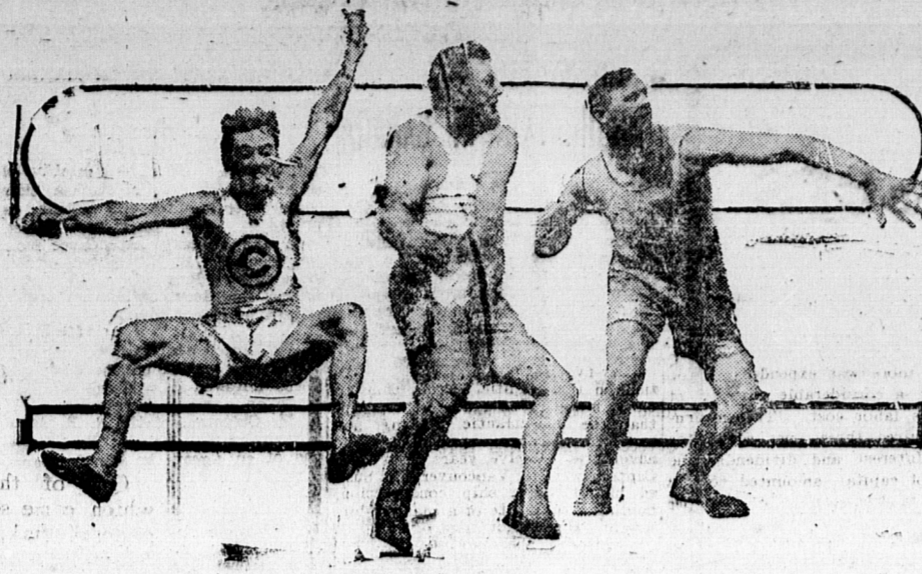

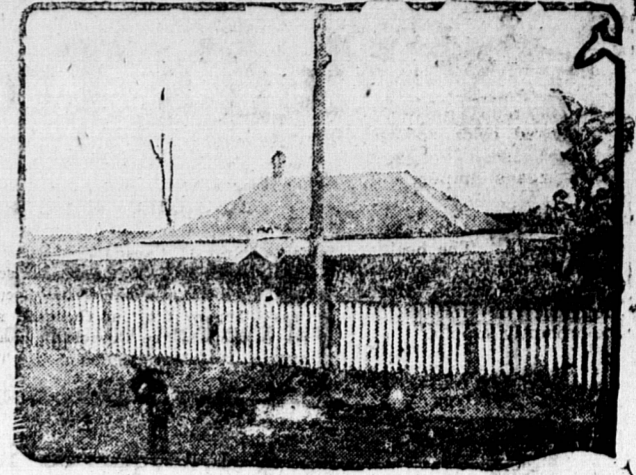
departed from London to attend the Newmarket race meeting, so that it is not likely that there will be any developments in the budget crisis until next week.

The suggestion of recourse to a referendum appeared in the Times meets with the sympathy of neither party, and the Government papers are emphatic in the assertion that the Ministers never intended to adopt such a plan.

It is said that Premier Asquith, having communicated to the King the Cabinet's decision, will insist that the House of Lords accept the budget without amendment. It is also reported that the Premier advised the King to consult with Lord Lansdowne and Mr. Balfour, the leaders of the Opposition respectively in the two Houses, and that this explains the audiences yesterday. Nothing authoritative, however, has been learned. John Redmond, leader of the Irish party, in a political speech last night declared that the only thing certain in the situation is that the country is on the eve of a general election.

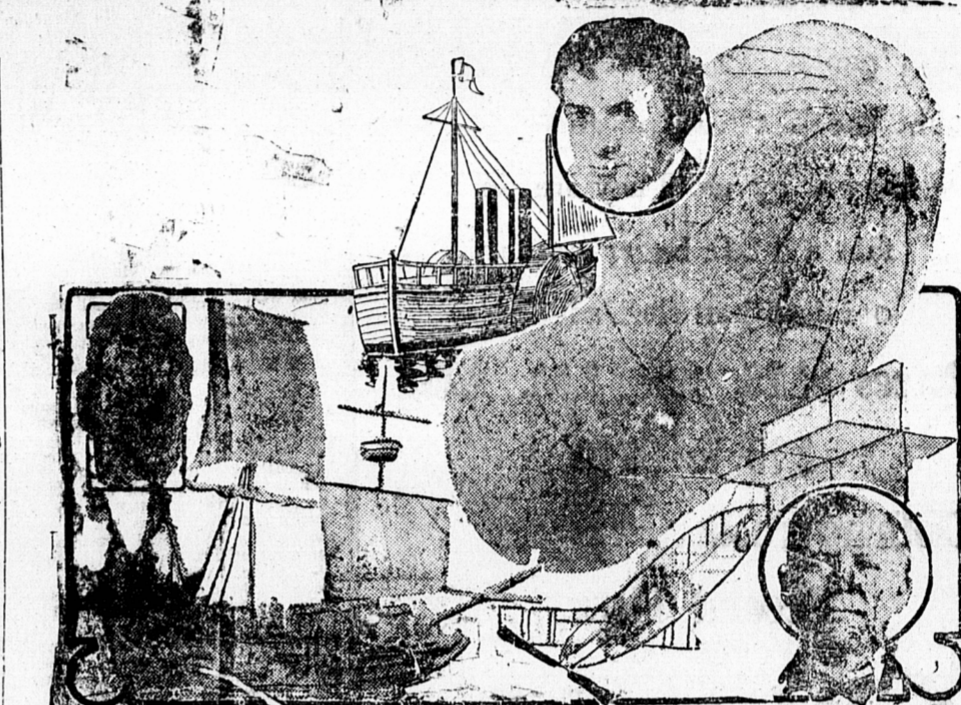
### MISSING LIBRARIAN IN MAD HOUSE

BOSTON, Mass., Oct 13—After a mysterious disappearance since August 12, Elizabeth G. Johnson, librarian at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and private secretary to Professor H. R. Cross of that institution was located today at the Observation Hospital at Deer Island. She was identified by a cousin, Miss Mary Hope of Brighton. Miss Johnson was found by the local authorities wandering about the city two weeks after her disappearance from the home of her uncle, Professor Thomas E. Pope, of the Institute of Technology with whom she lived and her mental condition was such that she was admitted to the Observation Hospital on Deer Island. Worry over the sickness of a sister and an aunt unbalanced her mentally, it is thought, for she was unable to recall her name or address.
