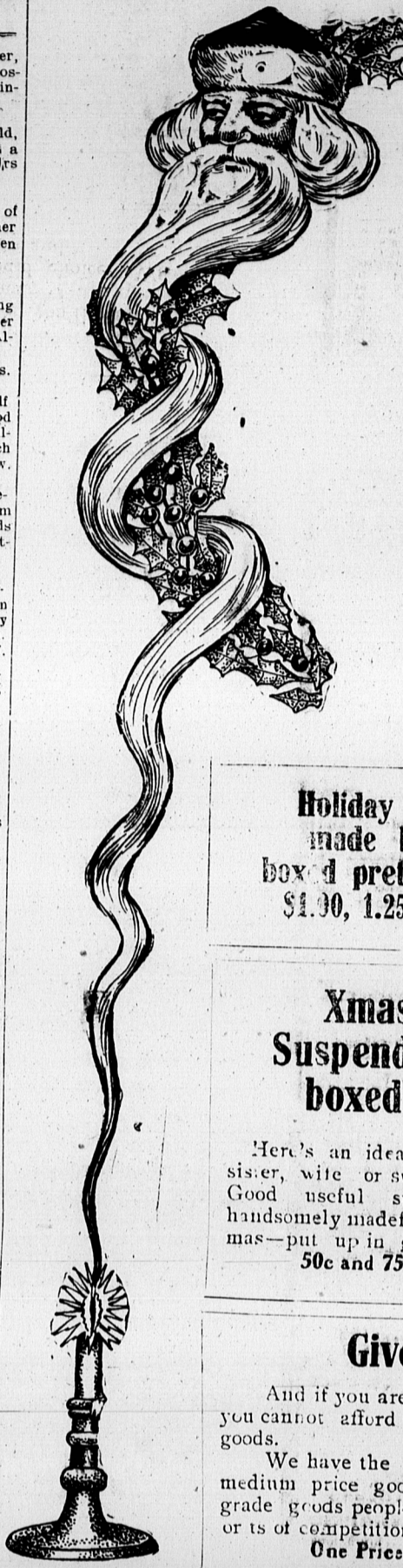

The latest news, first of all. Mrs. T. C. Baker, Summerside, went east to Charlottetown on Saturday for a short visit. Albert Schurman and a number of other prominent farmers left Summerside Saturday to attend the Winter Fair at Amherst. There was quite a number of crates of live poultry taken on board the Empress Saturday, en route to the Amherst Fair. Detectives Noble and Jones of the I.C.R. Police force, Moncton, are in Summerside in connection with the trial of Lewis and McIntyre in the Supreme Court. Lieut. Gov. McKinnon, Charlottetown, crossed by the Empress Saturday from Summerside to be present at the opening of the Winter Fair at Amherst. M. C. Stewart of the staff of the Insane Hospital, Stellarton, N. S., purchased a very fine driving horse from J. A. Ramsay, Summerside, a few days ago. Neil Campbell, Station Agent, Alberton, is in Summerside attending the court as a witness in the Lewis & McIntyre case in connection with the burglary in Alberton, Station last summer. The remains of Wm. Russel, who died in Charlottetown on the 3rd inst. came to Summerside by the mail train Saturday and were taken over by the Empress and forwarded to Moncton accompanied by Mrs. N. Armour, Charlottetown. A very interesting work is about being published by Prof. W. F. Ganong of Smith's College, Mass. It is a translation into English of a work of Father Leclerc, who was a missionary among the Micmacs of Gaspe in 1675, and who invented the system of hieroglyphic which was his first method of conveying their thoughts in written language. A very successful operation of Hernia was performed recently at the residence of Mrs. B. J. Haywood, Mill River, on Allie Marchbanks of Montrose, by Dr. Keir assisted by Drs. Ross and McEwen. This is one of the several critical operations that have been performed by Dr. Keir since his arrival at Mill River. Mr. Marchbank is steadily improving and expects to be out in the near future. The Indian Population of the Maritime Provinces will celebrate on the 24th of June next the tercentenary of the conversion of the supreme Chief of the tribe, Chief Mameberton who was converted on June 24th, 1610, at Annapolis, N. S. The event will be celebrated on Lennox Island next June as well as in other Micmac Centres. During those 300 years they have not lost in population but have more than held their own and among them are to be found some of the finest specimens of physical manhood. A few days ago a letter came from a man in Jersey City, signed H. H. Holt and addressed to Chief Police, Summerside, asking for information about his wife who came to this Province in the early part of last summer to visit friends at Coleman. He says he has had no definite information from her since that time. In the first week of July last the papers in this Province reported the death of a Mrs. Holt of Brooklyn, N. Y., who died at Coleman, after a very short illness, at the age of 25 years. This is supposed to be Mr. Holt's wife.

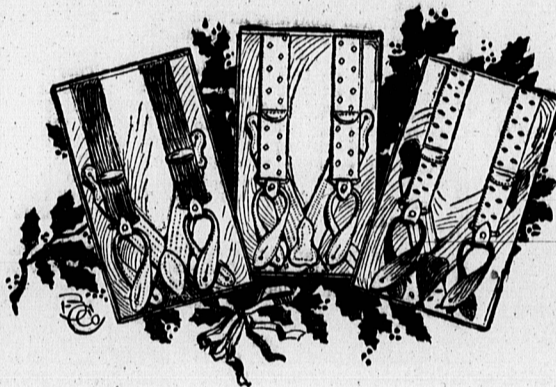
