PLANT LINE NEWS.—The S. S. Evangeline will make her last trip of the season from Charlottetown on Friday, October 10th. She will leave Boston on October 14th coming east as far as Halifax only. The A. W. Perry, which has been undergoing repairs in Boston since last May will be put on this route. She will make her first trip from here on October 15th to Halifax, where her freight and passengers will be transferred to the Evangeline and taken to Boston by the big boat. The Perry will continue on this route for the balance of the season, leaving here every Friday for Boston. The sailings of the S. S. Halifax on this route will be discontinued for this year. She goes on the slip at Halifax to-morrow to be extensively repaired and improved. Her last trip to this port was made last Tuesday. She is being repaired and fitted out in preparation for her sailings in southern waters this winter.

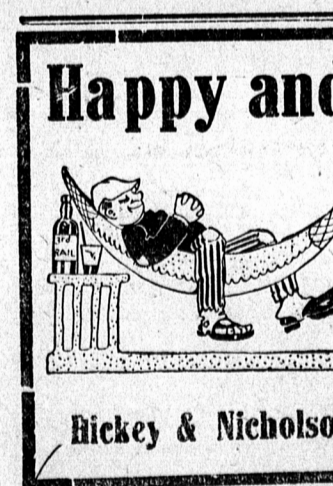

TRAGIC DEATH OF ITALIAN MINISTER

TURIN, Sept. 25.—(Special).—The death of Signor Teobaldo Calissano, Italian Minister of Posts and Telegraphs, and the youngest member of Signor Giovanni Giolitti's Cabinet, yesterday occurred under very dramatic circumstances.

He was presiding at a banquet attended by three hundred of his constituents and was delivering a speech in which he referred to the principal points of the Premier's platform at the approaching general elections—the Libyan war, the introduction of national insurance and universal suffrage. Suddenly he turned pale, his voice faltered and he collapsed into his chair, his head striking the table, while he gasped, "Water!"

His sons came to his aid, but found him dying. A priest was called and administered the last rights of the Church.

The Minister, who was only fifty years old, had an engagement with the King and the Premier to assist at the opening of a new railroad station at Cuneo today. The function was performed by the King, who desired not to disappoint the citizens of Cuneo.

TO SETTLE STRIKE CONDITIONS.

DUBLIN, Sept. 25.—Sir Geo. R. Askwith, Chief Industrial Commissioner has been summoned from London to attempt a settlement of the strike. Conditions have become so grave that troops are held ready to assist the police should the starving people begin looting.
