RE-TRAINING DISABLED SOLDIERS.

Another record which will occupy a prominent place in the future history of Canada's achievements in the Great War is the report of the Re-training of Canada's Disabled Soldiers.

The project of re-training disabled or partially disabled soldiers was undertaken by Mr. Segsworth in July 1917 when there were 638 men in training classes of all kinds.

The work grew steadily and rapidly until, in December 1919, there were 23,626 men receiving re-training of whom 9,505 had graduated.

The method followed in this great re-training scheme was devised with great care and after much study, and the story of its development is a most interesting one.

"It is definitely part of the policy of the Department in every case of disablement to train a man in an occupation as closely allied to his former one as possible.

The whole policy of the Vocational Branch was first to introduce to the man at his bedside the idea of work in ward occupations.

During 1915 all the allied countries had started a movement for the systematic training of handicapped soldiers. In the majority of these, if not indeed in all of them, the work was done by local committees and municipalities and the results were not satisfactory.

CURRENT COMMENT

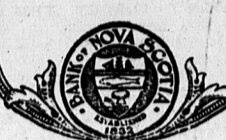

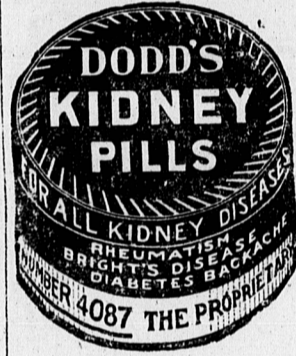
