The peculiar feature of the thing is Percy's deposition to the effect that he really believed that he was entering the real county jail by the window route.

The magistrate told him he would consider until two o'clock. He thought that Mr. Melville was in a rather awkward position.

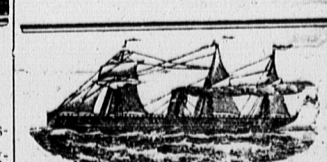
