RAILWAYS IN ASIA.

There has been in recent years a great development of railways in Asia. India has 28,000 miles, Japan 4,500 miles, China 2,000 miles to which must be added the Russian Siberian line, of 4,000 miles, 1,000 miles in French Indo China, 300 miles in the Malay peninsula, 350 miles in Siam and 1500 miles in Burmah. A few hundred miles of new road shortly to be built will connect the French Indo Chinese system with that of Burmah and India. From India the railway system stretches into Persia, and a few hundred miles would connect this with the 2,000 miles of railway in Asiatic Turkey.

These Turkish roads connect with those of southern Europe. When the comparatively short connecting links are constructed Asia will have two transcontinental systems, one northern, through Siberia, the other, southern through India, Persia and Asia Minor connecting the Far East with Europe. The immense effect of railways in promoting commerce is shown by the fact that since 1870 the foreign commerce of India has increased by \$258,000,000 and that of Japan by \$215,000,000 while China which has a vast population of industrious people but

few railways and those of recent construction, has increased but \$100,000,000 in the same period.

Some inquiries are being made as to the future mail arrangements on the Murray Harbor and Montague branch railways. The Guardian is informed that the matter is under consideration of the postal department but no change will be made for the present. As the existing contracts for the carriage of the mails in the south eastern section of the Province, which have not yet expired will have to be considerably re-arranged and the wants of the various sections must be duly considered before the change is made, some time will be required to adjust matters.

Prince Edward Island with over 200 miles of railway, has one mile of railway to each eight square miles of area, which is the highest ratio in Canada. New Brunswick comes next with a mile of railway to each 12 square miles. Our lines are of the narrow gauge, however, and for this reason, and from having no rail connection with the mainland are of less cost and less value than a like mileage elsewhere. We have one mile of railway to each 400 people while the average throughout the Dominion is one mile to 300, so that it cannot be charged that we have been unduly favored in this matter.

The death is announced of Christopher Robinson K. C. one of the most eminent lawyers in Canada and for years the acknowledged leader of the Ontario bar. He was born in Toronto in 1828. During a generation he has been connected with leading cases before the higher Canadian courts, the Privy Council and in international arbitrations. The criminal trials of Whelan, (for the murder of McGee) of Riel, the Behring Sea and Alaska Boundary Commissions are among the many famous matters in which his high professional talents were engaged. After the Behring Sea case he was offered knighthood which he declined, and he also declined repeated offers of judicial positions from successive governments.

SLAYER OF QUEEN CHAINED TO WALL

Luccheni Attempted to Kill a Prison Warden; Seized Attendant as He Bent Over Him.

GENEVA, Oct. 30.—Luccheni, the Nihilist, who seven years ago assassinated the Empress Elizabeth of Austria on the Quai de Mont Blanc, at Geneva, and who for his crime was sentenced to imprisonment for life, has again become wild and unmanageable.

He is in solitary confinement at the Eveche Prison, and from time to time gives way to fits of mad fury, when he tears up his clothing, refuses to work and attacks all who come near him. Some time ago he attempted to murder Capt. Alexander Perrin, the governor of the jail, and since then his warders have been particularly careful how they approach him.

Luccheni's latest escape is said to have been a cunning and deliberate plan to murder one of his warders and to try to escape. For days he feigned illness, and one night his warder, on entering the cell, saw the prisoner apparently unconscious on the floor.

As he carelessly bent over the prostrate man he felt his neck suddenly gripped in the sinewy fingers of the criminal, who, after almost strangling him, flung him to the ground and made for the door.

Here Luccheni ran into the arms of another warder, and after a savage struggle, during which the assassin clawed and bit like a wild beast, he was secured and chained to the wall of his cell.

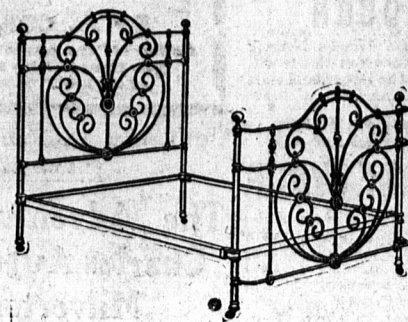

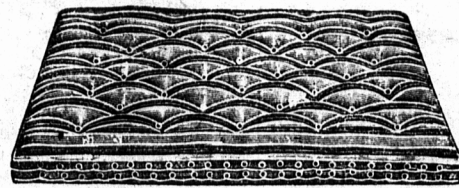

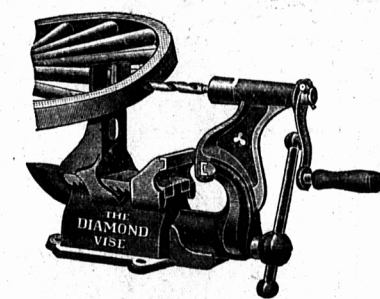
