Mrs Edwards, Halifax, arrived in the city Tuesday night by the Northumberland on a visit to friends here.

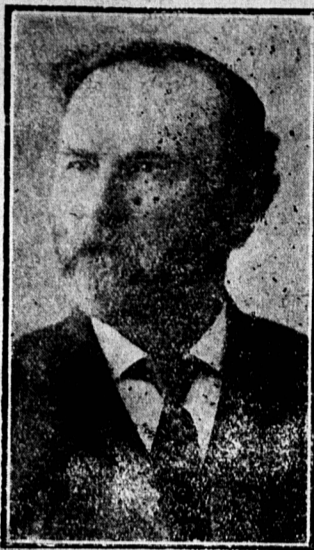
Egerton and Mrs Heaney, city, are visiting friends and relatives in Clifton.

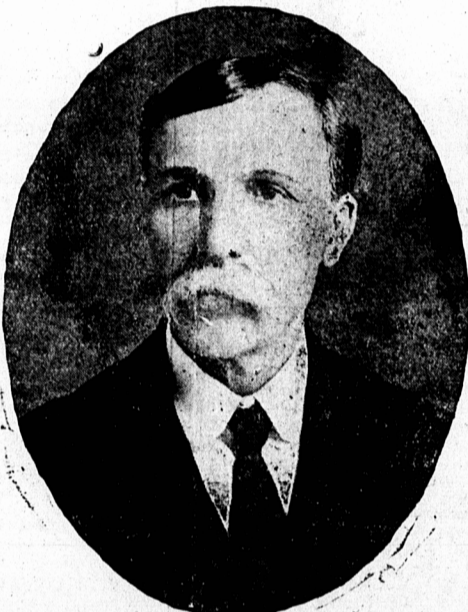

They do not want their lives trade and liberty any longer protected by the British "tar" and soldier with-out contributing to their maintenance.

STEAMERS COLLIDE AND TWO HUNDRED PERISH.

MONTE VIDEO, Aug. 25.—In a driving rainstorm the Argentine excursion steamer Columbia and the North German Lloyd steamer Schlessien collided at the extreme entrance of Monte Video harbor. The Columbia's bow was crushed in and she sank almost immediately. Between one hundred and seventy

and two hundred persons were killed or drowned.

The passengers were asleep at the time and a panic followed the crash. The Columbia carried two thousand passengers and a crew of forty-eight men.

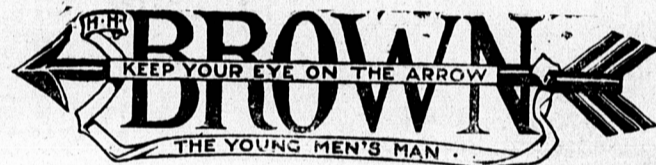

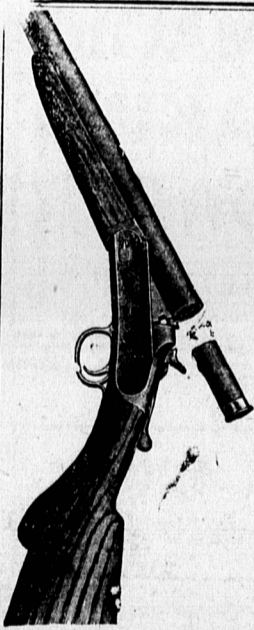
