A BISHOP WHO SETTLED DISPUTES

The Montreal Tribune in reviewing the career of the late Bishop McDonald has the following estimation:
When appointed to the See of Harbor Grace over thirty years ago, the second city of Newfoundland was in a state of turmoil from religious troubles. In the first place, the Orangemen and the Catholics were at variance, and in the second place, trouble had started with the Catholics over Society matters which saw two different factions spring up. To live in a place with trouble all around was not very inviting for a Bishop, yet Ronald McDonald faced the trouble with unflinching zeal and ardor, and by wise counsel, prudence, and the genial manner for which he was noted saw the end of those bitter strifes. He was a great power for good and he wielded it to the best advantage. He succeeded even at the eleventh hour where others had failed.
Troubles and family bickerings some of which baffled the courts, then, fell to the lot of the good Bishop to settle amicably, some of them being Protestant families.
On the Labrador coast in the different fishing stations many disputes among the horny-handed sons of toil on that rugged and bleak coast were put aside and things smoothed over calmly when His Lordship was the judge. The consolations of religion were brought to thousands during the fishing season around the territory of Labrador. With the fishermen, though he was a Bishop, yet for them he labored as a humble priest, and no sacrifice was too great for him to undergo to bring the help of religion.
When he was about to leave for Harbor Grace, where he had spent a quarter of a century, Protestants and Catholics alike presented him with addresses, but under no consideration would he accept any monetary gifts. He was one of the few Bishops in the Catholic Church to-day who lived on his resources never asking the customer's tithes from the priests of his Diocese for his support. A great leader has fallen in the fight, a valiant defender of the faith has been cut down by death, and a prince among men has gone to his reward. During

the past ten years Bishop McDonald had been suffering intensely, and six years ago spent some months in the Hotel Dieu of this city, where several operations were performed on him by the late Sir William Hingston. These gave him temporary relief, and each succeeding year he visited Montreal for treatment. Three years ago on his visit he preached during the High Mass at St. Patrick's Church.

AUSTRALIAN MATERNITY GRANT

Dispatches from Australia say that the measure proposed by the federal government there to provide a maternity grant of \$25 for each child born, and registered in the commonwealth is meeting with very mixed reception by the Australian women who view this proposition in a serious light.
The chief argument against it, on the part of the majority is the inadequacy of the benefit for the necessitous mother and the futility of giving it to the wealthy women, to whom such a small sum would be but a drop in the ocean. Why not, suggest the women, increase the benefit and give it only to the women who need it, rewarding the wealthier mothers in some other manner? That the measure will without doubt prove an inestimable benefit to the working-class wife who is oftentimes hard pressed to lay by a sufficient sum to meet the expense of the nurse and doctor, and who objects to apply for charity relief, is undeniable. Another good feature of the measure is that it does not discriminate against the unmarried mother, who will receive \$25 grant upon the registration of the child. The government, however, if the scheme is to be a success, will have to safeguard it at least in two respects—first, against unscrupulous parents who will take the \$25 and then leave the little ones in the charge of a benignant state to rear; secondly, that the money is really spent on the mother and child and not squandered away by the father, who, as the person registering the birth, will, under the present wording of the bill, be the recipient of the bounty.

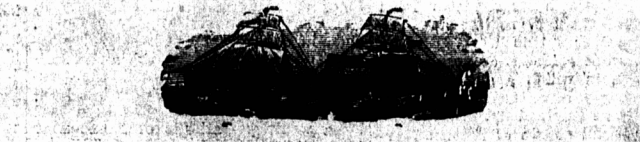
