SLEEPING HELMET OR BALANAVA CAP.

Four bone needles, No. 9, pointed at each end. One-half pound, 4-ply yarn, peacock or home made, makes 3 helmets Gray or dark colored.

Terms—P, plain; r, ribbed; k, knit; m, make; pl, purl. 1st row—k plain. 2nd row—k 1, m 1, k 23, m 1, k 1. 3rd row—k 1, m 1, k 25, m 1, k 1.

Go on making one stitch at beginning and end of each row till you have 45 stitches, then knit plain back and forth for 5 1/2 inches.

Now take the other two needles and repeat all this from beginning. (This makes the flap of back and front.)

Next, join the two flaps and knit with all four needles round and round, 3 plain, 3 purl, for four inches.

Then take off 21 stitches on a piece of string. (This should be ribbed 4 plain, 3 purl.)

Put the remaining stitches on 2 needles. After a few inches are done you can get them on one needle.

Leave off ribbing and knit plain back and fourth for 5 1/2 rows (or four inches.)

Next knit 15 stitches, take 2 together and knit to end of row, decreasing one each row, till you have about 45 stitches remaining; then k 9 only and take 2 together, still decreasing once in each row till 2 stitches remain, then reduce 4 times in each row till only 3 stitches remain.

Now resume your four pins, take up loops at the end of plain rows also the 21 stitches on the string; count them round; there should be 114 in all, including the 3 remaining on the pins. If there should be too many or too few, knit 2 together or make 1 on 2.

Knit and rib round and round as at first, matching your ribs on to those that were on the string. It is easiest to knit plain the first row till you arrive at those 21 stitches, then commence ribbing. Work thus for 2 1/2 inches.

Cast off loosely.

daughters and sisters of its porters and clerks have donned black frocks embroidered with the company's monogram and reopened the doors. In newspaper offices the porters are all women. Women clean the streets at night, and women have begun to drive the taxicabs. Women of all sorts—governesses, stenographers, shopkeepers, even—are leaving Paris every day to assist on the farms of France.

But as for the "oldest trade in the world"—what of the daughters of joy in these troublous times? The days are past when every army had its skirt of camp followers; the ladies of the street have a little place in this new, serious-minded town from whence the men, their prey, have gone. And yet they have fallen in perforce with the wonderful judgment of the times and found their place. Two days after war was declared every "fille" upon the police cards was rounded up and dispatched to the hospital of St. Lazare, there to sew bandages and to load cartridges for the war! Every respectable woman in Paris who hasn't actually to work for her living is in the Red Cross.

POOR LITTLE CLEMENTINE.

Yes, Paris is resuming its normal state, say the papers. But is it? Ask poor little Clementine, the melancholy bonnie at our pension. She is on her feet all day, answering the bells of the boarders; she works all the rest of the time in the kitchen peeling potatoes and washing dishes. No veal or pudding or wine for Clementine—all she gets is bread and water and gravy and six dollars a month, which will just about pay for her room in another house down the street. There's little left for her baby, away at Rheims with her mother, who can ill afford nourishing food. But today Clementine has been informed that there is no more money to pay her wages. Of course, she may work on for nothing. The question for Clementine is serious. Shall she work herself to death plus six dollars a month for bread, water and gravy, or accept the 1.25
