(By George Barton Outten, President Colgate University) Isn't it about time we became serious about this war? Do we want to win it, or do we want to forget about it in a national drunken debauch?

ALCOHOL MOST SERIOUS HEALTH PROBLEM

(1) Health One medical authority in this country lists our five most serious health problems as: alcohol, tuberculosis, venereal disease, cancer, and heart troubles—and he places alcohol first.

ALCOHOL AGGRAVATES OTHER HEALTH PROBLEMS

But this is not all; alcohol is not only a serious problem in its own right, but two of the other problems are aggravated by it. For years we have known that tuberculosis is made more dangerous by the use of alcohol, and some physicians say that as many as 90 per cent of venereal infections are contracted when under the influence of alcohol.

TRAFFIC FATALITIES AND ALCOHOL

One need scarcely mention the matter of alcohol and accidents, especially automobile accidents. Forty thousand persons are killed and a million and one-half injured every year in the United States by automobile accidents, and the percentage caused by drinking is estimated anywhere from 40 per cent of these down.
