## THE IMMIGRATION IS ENORMOUS

Officials Expecting a Quarter of a Million

To Cross the Atlantic—Thousands Arrive Weekly—A Steady Influx of Women to the Northwest is Needed.

It is not too much to say that before the season is over 300,000 immigrants will have entered Canada since last year, said John Hoolahan, Dominion Immigration Agent, this morning, and judging from the crowds which pour through Windsor Street station every day his prediction will probably be verified.

In the last three days—or to be correct, since Monday morning, more than 5,000 immigrants bound for the Canadian West have been handled through Montreal. Consignments from three steamers expected to arrive from Quebec to-night or to-morrow will increase the number by more than 1,000, as the Numidian has 650 and the Barcelona and Pretorian 400 each. Four hundred from the Sicilian passed through this morning and went west at 9.40.

It is estimated that this season already about 50,000 immigrants have gone to the West, while last season's record was about 100,000. As the season is just about half over the officials expect that last year's record will be more than equalled before the tide of travel begins to slacken.

The great majority of the immigrants are of British birth, and they certainly have made a favorable impression upon all with whom they have come in contact as being a most desirable class of settlers. Well dressed and well groomed, they bear every evidence that their former surroundings were those of comfort, and in some cases even luxury.

Most of them are well supplied with money, and a large proportion are practical farmers.

"One thing needed is more women," said one of the officials this morning, while discussing the immigration generally. "Without the women the homes in the west will not be established as quickly as they would be otherwise, but the women will come, for they must recognize that Canada offers them advantages they cannot get at home."

Although the season is a most successful one.

Immigration to the Province of Quebec is also proceeding well, and last week Mr. Marquette, Provincial Immigration Officer, placed seventy-five families in the Eastern Townships. The demand for farm laborers Mr. Marquette reports as far in excess of the supply.—Montreal Herald, 19th.

## THE RUSSIANS WANT BALLOONS

Make Desperate Efforts to Reach Port Arthur

The Russians Now Firmly Convinced That the Japanese Were Using Submarine Boats in Sinking Warships.

St. Petersburg, May 19.—The admiralty has received an official despatch from Rear Admiral Wittebeck, believed to have been dated from Port Arthur, May 14 reporting that there has been no fighting since the telegraph line was cut, the Japanese ships not having attacked. Everything was well with the Russian squadron. The despatch was gratifying to the authorities not only for the news it contained, but because its receipt established the fact that while the telegraph line is severed a system of communication by means of Chinese runners has been satisfactorily inaugurated. In order to deliver the Liao Yang despatches entrusted to him, the runner has to pass through the Japanese lines, already thrown across the narrow neck of the peninsula. Just above Port Arthur for the purpose of cutting off all communication between General Kurapatkin and the fortress the passage of the runner was dangerous, but the task was light compared to what it will be when the Japanese forces closely invest Port Arthur. Nevertheless the officials express confidence that arrangements have been made to insure the frequent transmission of despatches which, if captured, are unintelligible to the Japanese as they are in cipher.

One of the reasons for the desperate effort of the Russians to get to Port Arthur what is officially called an "ammunition train" has been revealed by information which leaked out today. There was little need, it appeared, for more ammunition, great quantities being stored in the fortress, but General Stoessel was exceedingly anxious to be provided with balloons. The highest point of the fortress is the Eagles' Nest, from which much of the surrounding country can be seen, but balloons will facilitate operations. The Russians' balloons are stationary.

St. Petersburg, May 18.—The admiralty is now convinced by mail reports received from Port Arthur that Vice Admiral Togo used submarine boats in his operations. A letter from Lieut. General Stoessel says that he was standing on Golden Hill when the Russian battleship Petropavlovsk went down and he saw a submarine boat torpedo the battleship. Lieut. Schrieber claims he distinctly saw the horizon of a submarine boat and could trace the course of the vessel. Officers of the Russian battleship Pobleda testified that a submarine boat discharged a torpedo against the ship and they fired at the submarine boat, hoping to sink it, but failed. The same letters describe the reverence of the Russians for the overcoat of the Vice Admiral Makaroff, when it was taken out of the water. On its approach they bared their heads, made the sign of the cross and prayed for the repose of the admiral's soul. It is officially denied that Viceoyr Alexief has gone to Liao Yang to assume command of 20,000 troops there, and that Gen. Kurapatkin has left Liao Yang for Harbin. It is said that Kurapatkin is either at Liao Yang or in its vicinity.
