### THE BOER GENERALS IN EUROPE.

The Boer generals are having a strange and varied experience. By a consensus of opinion throughout the civilized world they are accredited with being bold, able and resourceful commanders. This being so, and the world being so ready to acclaim military prestige, it is but natural that Dewet, Botha and Delarey should have many admirers in almost any civilized land they may visit. We doubt not they would be very cordially received in Canada, should they visit this country. They have been met in the most friendly and conciliatory spirit by all classes in England from the King and the nobility down to the masses of the people. There was a homely heartiness in the exclamations of the British people which quite touched the Boer leaders' hearts.

It was well that they first visited England before proceeding to Holland. Among the Dutch people, who are kindred in race and language, the Boer generals were sure of cordial greetings and plaudits whenever or however they might come. Doubtless their welcome in Deutschland would have been even more enthusiastic had they won the fight and established their independence in South Africa. Dutch sympathy was warmly with their cause as well as with the men. But having first visited England and paid their court to King Edward as their lawful sovereign, no objection will be made in the British Isles to any amount of lionising and hero-worship they may receive on the Continent. The Boer commanders appear to have comforted themselves with dignity both in England and in Holland. They have been reserved in their utterances, but nowhere have they given any indication of other than good faith toward the peace treaty by which they are bound.

On what authority we know not, it is intimated that the military leaders who came to the front, are likely to become political leaders in the Transvaal and Orange River Colony. The transformation will be a comparatively easy one. They have won the admiration of their people and have shown courage and gifts of leadership. These conditions will readily place them at the front in political affairs when constitutional government is again fully established. It is intimated too that they favor the federation of South Africa, which they hope to make a self-governing Dutch Commonwealth under the British Crown. This may be yet accomplished. Under British rule in Canada we have seen more than one former rebel become a loyal political leader. Such were Sir George Cartier who had been a rebel in Lower Canada, and Thomas D'Arcy McGee who in his youth was a rebel in Ireland.

A federated South Africa, if formed to day would be pretty evenly divided, but with a preponderance of descendants of Dutch blood. A few years hence, should there be a large influx of immigrants, the scale might be turned. No doubt for a time there will be a political strife partly based on racial lines. There will be talk of "Dutch domination" there, just as there has been talk of "French domination" in Canada. But under just and equitable principles these difficulties will be solved in time. Under the British system the majority must rule, whether in Canada or

South Africa. We doubt not that South Africa will always remain British, and we see no reason why fifty years hence or even at a much earlier period, the Dutch population of that country may not be as loyal supporters of the British flag and institutions and as friendly to their English fellow-subjects as are today our French speaking compatriots of Quebec.

The great power canal on the American side of the Soo has been completed after four years of labor, at a cost of \$5,000,000. It is 220 feet broad and 22 feet deep. The water power is turned to account by 320 turbine wheels giving 40,000 horse power, which will light the streets and drive the electric cars of the adjoining cities. The power is controlled by the Clergue company and will be utilised to build up the industries on both the American and Canadian sides of the Soo.

There is a reported prospect that New Brunswick may have a general Provincial election within a few months to come. The present House was elected on 18th February, 1899, and the term being four years, it will expire in February next. It has already had four sessions, and although another might be held before the date of expiry it would necessarily be called much earlier than usual or be of short duration. The New Brunswick legislative sessions generally begin in February or March. As in the other Maritime Provinces, the Opposition in New Brunswick gives little indication of active vitality.

London Tit Bits has interviewed a fashionable London hatter who has something interesting to say about royal heads. We clip the following: "All the home and foreign royalties favor us with orders. Every year I send big consignments of hats abroad—to the Russian court, the royal family of Germany, to the Danish court, and to a multitude of celebrities. It is interesting and appropriate to note at the present festive season that the gentleman who in our opinion has the most magnificent head in the world is our beloved King. I had the distinguished honor of making His Majesty's hats when he was Prince of Wales. His size is a full seven, and his head is the most perfectly proportioned I have ever seen. It has the unique peculiarity of being precisely the same shape on either side. His Royal Highness, the Prince of Wales, has a fine oval-shaped head, and the size he takes is six and five-eighths. His shape rather resembles that of the Russian Emperor, but the size of the latter's headgear is six and seven eighths.
