WOUNDED IN FACE.—Mr. Harvey Manderson, Malpeque, has been notified that Pte. Harvey Manderson, Infantry is officially reported admitted to 83 Gen. Hospital (Boulogne) Sep. 27th. Gun shot wound in face. Private Manderson was transferred from the 105th Batt. to the 26th Batt. in March of this year.

FISHING REGULATIONS.—Under the new regulations for fisheries, issued last week, it is required that on the Northumberland Straits between a line drawn from Chalkfish River N.B. to West Point, P.E.I. and one drawn from River Philip, N.S. to Victoria Harbor, P.E.I. the fishing season shall be Aug 16 to Oct 15. Every lobster fisherman shall hereafter obtain a license before entering into fishing. The fee for such license is twenty five cents. It is understood that fishermen or canneries breaking the law will have their license cancelled.

GLEANINGS FROM OVERSEAS: Mrs. (Capt.) Walker, 147 Elm Avenue City, has received a letter from her son George in which he says that he is quite well and safe after having been through some very hard fighting and hopes to hold out until the last. One can't imagine, he writes, what a person can go through and never get touched. The boys were falling all around him and he says it was all luck. Of the thirty two in his platoon only ten came out, three were killed and the rest had slight wounds. The writer's best soldier friend A.S. McKay was hit in the stomach with shrapnel and was killed. He was from S'side. There were quite a number or 105 th. boys killed or wounded. The Colonel of that company whom all the boys loved was also killed.

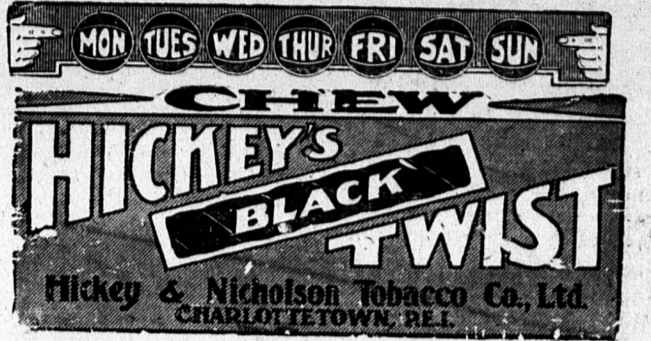
