IMPROVE CANADA NATIONAL HEALTH

OTTAWA, July 20 (CP)—The new Child and Maternal Hygiene Division of the Department of Pensions and National Health is already making progress with a survey to determine factors contributing to Canada's high infant and maternal mortality rate. When the survey is completed, it will suggest remedial steps in finding indicate, Canada's death rate is admittedly higher than it should be, and poor in comparison with two or three other countries of comparable national stock and condition of life, officials here admit. The child and maternal mortality rate, in particular, is above that of some other countries where vigorous methods have been employed to assure the baby a safe start in life and to make maternity relatively safe.
