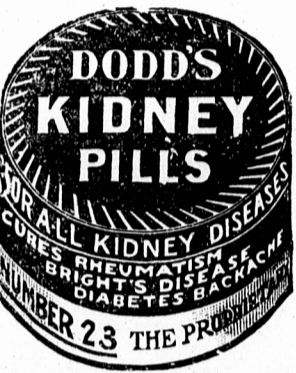

The Maritime Express arriving in Montreal at 6.30 p. m., connects with the Grand Trunk night express for Toronto, leaving Montreal at 10.30 p. m., and arriving in Toronto at 7.30 a. m. the following day. Returning, travellers have their choice of the two finely equipped through trains out of Montreal, the Maritime Express, leaving at 8.15 a. m., and the Ocean Limited, leaving at 7.30 p. m., daily except Saturday.

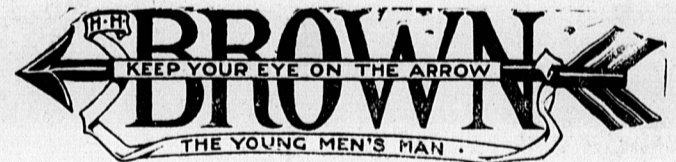
