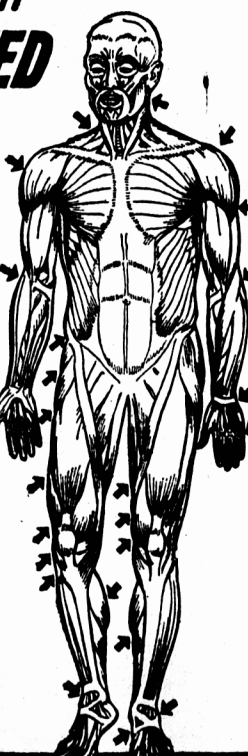

Religion And Life

This week we keep Remembrance Day. The memory of our heroes who gave their lives that freedom might not perish from the earth will be fresh in our minds.

The second contribution that the soldier made to his nation is the inspiration of his example, and his illustration of the principle of self-sacrifice.

Consider our own Canada. A Canadian paper in March, 1906 published a letter which told the story of the origin of "Manitoba Hard."

A quantity of wheat was taken directly from a vessel unloading wheat at Glasgow from Russia and sent to David Fife, who planted it. It all grew, but all rusted badly, excepting five heads from one root.

Two of those were eaten by an ox, but the other three heads were rejected and the grains planted. Again they ripened without rusting, and their owner found that he had a treasure.

As his store increased, he distributed it among his neighbors, and from there it was sent to the great west, then opening up for settlement.

This miracle of nature was repeated some years later. To quote from an address by Mr. Charles Wheat-breeder: "One head of Marquis Wheat in 1908 had grown to three hundred million bushels in 1912."

These are Canada's illustrations of the truth of Jesus' words: "Except a grain of wheat fall into the ground and die, it brings forth much fruit."

There are two services that a soldier renders his nation. First, he repels the enemy. Our men put their lives between the foe of freedom and their own homes and the blind, ignorant people to the institutions stand because of their heroic devotion.

Some may ask: Does this illustration of the grain of wheat mean that in order to be fruitful my own life must perish? Jesus would answer: Do not press the figure too far. It means just that in the wheat field; it did mean that for many of our soldiers whose devotion we recall today; but in our ordinary pursuits self-sacrifice leads to self-realization.
