## FINANCE

NEW YORK, Nov. 26—(AP)—Aside from isolated firm spots, the stock market finished the week with an indefinite trend Saturday.

Steels and selected issues put on a mild recovery show, after an early slump, but closing prices in the short session were well scrambled in the proceedings that were sluggish throughout.

The Associated Press average for 60 stocks was unchanged on the day at 51.1. On the week the composite showed a net decline of one full point. Transfers Saturday totalled 293,110 shares. The week's volume was the smallest since the period ending July 8.

Up fractions to more than a point were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Republic and Youngstown. General Motors and Chrysler emerged at their final Friday quotations.

Generally the Canadian group was firm with only Ford and Imperial Pfd showing fractional declines. Ahead from 1-4 to 3-4 were Distillers Seagram, International Nickel and Walkers, among others.

Holding modest advances today were U. S. Rubber, Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, Douglas Aircraft, Columbia Broadcasting, Southern Railway, Standard Oil of N. J., American Can, American Telephone and American Smelting.

Losers up to a point were Du Pont, Johns-Manville, J. I. Case, United Aerial, Glen Martin, Texas Corp., and Santa Fe.

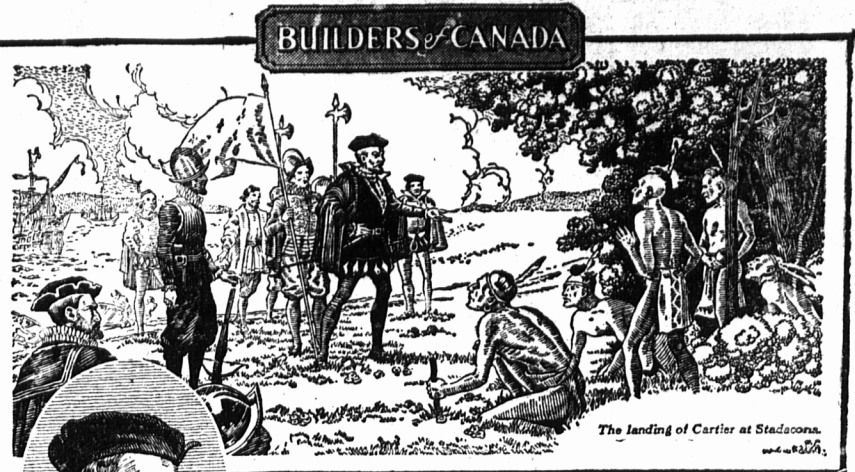
