Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any other person who has been in possession of a section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house, worth \$100. The area of cultivation is subject to regulation in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Livestock may be substituted for cultivation on certain conditions.

GERMAN EXPANSION AT AUSTRIA'S COST

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

LONDON.—Increasing friction between Germany and Austria is indicated by an article in the Frankfurter Zeitung, which points out the undesirability of permitting a German irredenta comprising 10,000,000 Germans living in Austria.

The newspaper figures that the residents of the German-inhabited sections of Austria cannot be good Austrians and good Germans simultaneously. It intimates that these Germanic portions of Austria should become German and that Austrian Poland should be included in the rehabilitated kingdom of Poland, though it is not suggested that the German parts of Poland should be included.

This is the most pointed expression on the subject yet given in the semi-official German press, though a considerable number of suggestions have been made lately looking toward Germany's expansion at the expense of Austria after the war.

EXPLOSIVES SEIZED AND FOREIGNERS ARRESTED AT CHRISTIANIA, NORWAY

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

LONDON.—The seizure of a quantity of explosives which have just reached Christiania, Norway, from Germany, and the arrest of three foreigners, has been officially confirmed according to a Copenhagen despatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company. The police are continuing the investigation and when the details are known another official communication, it is stated, will be announced.

The Tidens Tegn says that 1,000 kilograms of explosives were seized including a number of infernal machines. One of the men arrested is Aron Rautenfels, a German citizen, born in Finland, who declared that the bombs were intended for use in Finland. According to the newspaper, however, the infernal machines which were enclosed in cases resembling lumps of coal, were to have been put aboard Norwegian ships in the coal bunkers. It adds that the discovery of the plot probably explains the loss of many Norwegian ships which were supposed to have been mined or torpedoed.

Christiania despatches received here say that the leader of those arrested calls himself Baron Von Rautenfels. The Christiania despatches say that there have been five other arrests including two Finlanders named Pehrson and Wirauen, in whose lodgings the bulk of the explosives was found and also much incriminatory matter, identical with that found in the baggage of the Swedish Baron Von Rosen, who was arrested in Christiania last winter, but was subsequently released.

The Baron Von Rosen referred to above, fled to Norway after his pro-German activities had aroused suspicion among the Swedish authorities.

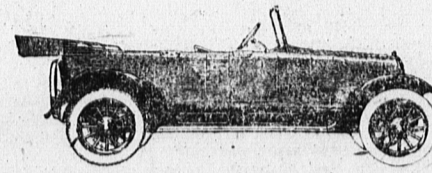
