Taschereau Government Narrowly Escapes Defeat In Sensational Contest

Alliance Of Conservatives And Action Liberale Nationale Cuts Down Liberal Majority From 68 To 6. Results Liberals 48, Opposition 42.

By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, Nov. 25.—The Quebec Liberal Government tonight emerged victorious from the closest election in the history of the province but with its majority of 68 cut to six before the vigorous attack of the alliance of Conservatives and Action Liberale Nationale parties.

King George II Resumes Throne After a Day of Delirious Acclaim.

(By Guardian's Special Wire) ATHENS, Nov. 25.—Accepting the resignation of Regent George Konradis, King George II resumed his throne tonight after a day of delirious acclaim from the Athenian populace and turned to the question of reuniting Greece.

Lay In State

Over the weekend the body lay in state in the Henry VII chapel of Westminster Abbey, guarded by naval ratings from Chatham. The lying in state was entirely private.
