GENERAL CONDITIONS

Entries close Friday, June 22nd, 1928. Horses must be eligible on that date.

All races mile heats; to be raced on the 3-heat plan, viz:--10% of each purse will be awarded the winner, the remainder to be divided in three equal parts, one part to be raced for each heat.

All purses divided 50, 25, 15 and 10 per cent. Entry fee 5% of Purse, 5% additional from Winners.

Two entries of the same ownership may start in the same race, providing the full 5% is paid on each starter, the drivers having the approval of the Judges.

The management reserve the right to declare off, change order of programme, decline any entry, bar any driver, declare off and fill without re-advertising any races not satisfactorily filled.

If weather is stormy, or track is in unfavourable condition so that racing cannot be carried on at the time advertised. The management reserve the right to postpone or declare the races off, and return the entrance monies.

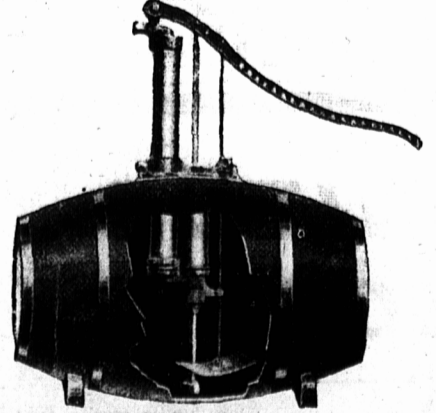
