As he entered the door he asked if the doctor was in and said he felt badly. Mr. McLellan and Mr. Harry James who were standing near noticing his condition caught him as he was about to collapse and carried him into the doctor's office. The doctor arrived in a few minutes but nothing could be done for him. Mr. Hall was one of Sherbrooke's most prosperous farmers and always took an active interest in all that pertained to the public welfare of the community. He leaves to mourn a sorrowing wife (nee Miss Marchbank, of New Annapolis), one brother, Mr. Samuel Hall, of Sherbrooke, and three sisters, Mrs. John Shilliker, of Sherbrooke, Mrs. Robert Waugh, of St. Eleanor's, and Mrs. Arthur Howatt, San Francisco, Cal. His funeral takes place from his late residence to Bedeque Cemetery on Friday, the 7th inst., at 2 o'clock.—X.

—SEED MEETING.—On Tuesday, May the 11th, at 10.30 a.m. there will be held in Summerside a meeting of those interested in the Co-operative Seed Association which was incorporated at the recent meeting of the Legislature. During the past three years the members of the Banner Oat Club have received considerable advance for their oats over ordinary market prices and this Seed Association is more or less a continuation of the Banner Oat Club. Any farmers who are planning to join the Co-operative Seed Association should secure the best possible seed for at least five acres of grain and be prepared to enter it in the Fields of Standing Grain Competition. One of the rules of the Banner Oat Club was, that no oats would be accepted by the Club unless it had been inspected by the Judge of the Fields of Standing Grain Competition, and there is no doubt that this will be one of the rules of the Co-operative Seed Association. It is getting late now to look about for seed oats but there is still some to be had, and nobody can take advantage of the Club this year who does not have absolutely pure seed. It is not expected that the Co-operative Seed Association will be in a position to handle all kinds of seed oats this year. In fact it is generally expected that its activity will be confined almost altogether to Banner oats. That however, will depend very largely on the membership, and the meeting to be held in Summerside in the Municipal Hall on Tuesday next. It is hoped the attendance will be large and that farmers will come prepared to discuss this matter in a business way.
